### FRANCE PLANS TO BAR FOREIGNERS

PARIS, Aug. 17.—Germany's announced intentions of officially aiding the emigration of great numbers of her over-crowded population to other parts of Europe and also to all the South American countries has brought about a real problem.

Germany's problem is simply one of sending away a portion of her people. Her sole intention is to find the best, most promising countries, France and Spain, on the other hand, have more complex situations to be handled.

France's first difficulty is to find the most practical solution for the problem of sending away her people, but of keeping foreigners from entering the country in too great numbers. France has ever been, of all the countries of Europe, the nation most settled by peoples from foreign colonies.

Ordinarily France welcomed the newcomers, but the conditions have so changed since 1914 that in justice to her own people, France must keep the nation rather free of foreigners. The root of the problem, in France's case, is the high cost of living. The supplies of food and clothing and other necessities have been and will continue to be altogether too limited to supply both the native population and the great influx from other lands.

Several measures have been proposed as possible solutions. One of the more interesting is the proposition that foreigners be subject to special income taxes. This measure, which is not to be applied in the case of men who fought in the French army, provides for the taxing of allied subjects 20 per cent on their incomes; neutral subjects 30 per cent, and for the "taxation of enemy subjects, at least for a period of ten years, at 100 per cent. To make the measure doubly effective the taxes would be collected from the employers of the foreign subjects.

That, briefly, is France's problem—how to save France for the French people.

Spain wants to retain the benefits of her national opportunities for her own people, but at the same time is not averse to assistance from the outside and does not object to immigration of the kind. It is not a complete barrier that Spain would establish, but rather a very careful method of selection.
