**MRS. RUSSEL SAGE LED MODEST LIFE**

NEW YORK, Nov. 2.—A supplementary report of the personal property of Mrs. Margaret Olivia Sage, widow of Russell Sage, whose estate was appraised at \$49,000,000, reflects the modest life led by the philanthropist, who left four-fifths of her estate to public institutions.

Mrs. Sage did not own a collection of valuable paintings or other objects of art, as is usual for one possessing her great wealth. Her jewelry had total value of \$2,784 and consisted of forty-four items, ranging in value from \$5 to \$800. Her clothing, exclusive of furs, also showed the simplicity of the widow of the famous financier, for it was appraised at only \$288. Mrs. Sage owned four automobiles, but their appraised value was only \$2,885.

The \$800 article of jewelry was a three-stone diamond ring. The \$5 item a pearl and silver mounted brooch. Other items of jewelry were: Tiffany watch, \$150; emerald and diamond cluster ring, no value given; also mounted brooch, \$7.50. The values placed on articles of apparel left by Mrs. Sage, were: crepe de chine tea gown, \$5; black mull dress with vest of lace, \$1; black silk dress, \$5; two silk jersey sweaters, \$1 each; two lavender tea gowns, \$2; a black lace dress was appraised at \$75, this being the highest value placed on any article in Mrs. Sage's wardrobe. The furs were scheduled at \$205 and included a carai coat, \$125, and a broadcloth and squirrel coat, which because of its worn appearance, was appraised at \$20.

**U. S. MAN SETS NEW ALTITUDE RECORD**

NEW YORK, Nov. 2.—A new official world's altitude record with a passenger was made October 4 by Major R. W. Schroeder when he ascended to the height of 31,800 feet at Dayton, Ohio, with Lieut. George W. Eisey as his passenger.

In making public the record today, officials of the American Flying Club predicted that aerial battles of the future will be fought at extremely high altitudes in machines capable of rising eight miles above the earth.

The record, which has just been promulgated by the flying club, was made in a Le Pere machine, fitted with a 40-horsepower Liberty motor equipped with a "super-charger" for increasing the motor's efficiency at high altitude. The machine is said to be capable of reaching a height of 37,000 feet, and Major Schroeder believes he would have reached that altitude but for a broken water pipe which forced him to descend after he had reached 31,800 feet.

A new set of non-breakable water pipes has been installed in the machine, and, weather permitting, Major Schroeder will attempt to better his record within the next two weeks. The major is chief test pilot of the airplane engine division of the air service.

**William H. Hardy, eighty-four years old, sole survivor of the famous Perry expedition, died yesterday in Portland, Ore., of pneumonia, after a week's illness.**

Captain Hardy was born in Harpswell, Me., in May, 1835, and joined the United States navy when seventeen, making the trip to Japan. He enlisted and served all through the civil war, and at the close of which he entered the merchant service. He served in this for several years and then retired upon being appointed a deputy United States marshal in Arizona.

He chanced to be in Japan in 1857 at the time when they were holding a celebration to commemorate the famous voyage, of which he was the sole survivor. He was discovered by the American ambassador, and after donning a frock coat over his sailor uniform was taken by the plenipotentiary and presented to the Mikado. Despite the ludicrous appearance of his bell-shaped trousers showing underneath his coat he was warmly received and showered with honors.


