PRESIDENCY GOING BEGGING IN FRANCE

With Election Only Two Months Away, No Candidate Has Appeared.

PARIS, Nov. 13.—No one seems to want to be President of France. While candidates for the same post in the United States are bobbing up daily, according to cable reports here there hasn't been a single avowed candidate for the French honor to date—and the election is only two months away.
Premier Clemenceau's name has been mentioned repeatedly as President Poincare's successor, but "The Tiger" has not given the slightest indication that he wants the place. Nothing in the way of a declaration of future intentions has come from the premier since he announced a fortnight ago his intention, based on necessity, of retiring from politics and taking a long rest, much needed because of his advanced age.

Clemenceau Could Win.
This announcement would not necessarily exclude him from the Presidency, because in France the post is regarded as a sort of final retirement honor for aged men who have finished their political careers. There are even those who maliciously declare that Clemenceau's announcement of his retirement fits in perfectly with the requirements of the Presidency. Besides, they point out, "The Tiger" for the last twenty years has been saying periodically, "I'm an old man now. I've got to retire soon."
Should Clemenceau really become a candidate there seems little doubt that he would receive a flattering majority.

If he declined to run, however, there is no one else who has appeared on the political horizon, and it seems likely today that when the parliamentary session convenes at Versailles in January to elect a President, it will have to put up a candidate.

Military Cast Determined.
Meantime, all France is in the throes of its general elections for the Chamber and Senate. There is no out and out issue, except a determined fight on the part of some parties against Bolshevism and an equally determined fight by Socialists for their particular program. Every indication is that the Clericals will secure a considerable representation in the new Parliament.
Individual candidates are presenting the most interesting sidelights on the elections. The French military cast and the army generally, having had some hard and incompetent handling during the war, apparently is determined to have its own block in the government hereafter. As a consequence, among the candidates for Parliament are Generals Sarrail, Castelnau, Gouraud and Clergerie, all heroes of the battle of the Marne and other campaigns of the great war. Fonic the military caste, also is a candidate. He has announced that he doesn't know a single thing about politics but intends to reach Parliament to see that France's future aviation interests are handled properly, and there appears little question of his success.

Another interesting candidate is Leon Daudet, son of the famous French novelist and editor of L'Action Francaise, the leading Royalist Clerical paper of France, to whose efforts during the war was due the arrest of Malvy, Bolo Fasha, Caillaux, Lenoir and other alleged traitors. Daudet's election would mean a triumph for the Royalist Clerical parties.
Caillaux himself would have been a candidate for reelection to the Chamber for the purpose of permitting the electors to express their public opinion of his alleged guilt, but the Senate tribunal refused to give him provisional liberty to make his campaign, and he was forced to withdraw his candidacy.
Still another interesting candidate is Andre Fallieres, son of the ex-President of France. Briand also is an important candidate, in that he is putting up a fight that would indicate he seeks the premiership when Clemenceau steps down.

The French politics are taking an important part in every campaign meeting. They ask each candidate four questions: "Where were you during the war? What did you do during the war? What was your fortune before the war? And what is it now?"
These questions are posers, for, while candidates may squirm out of the precise figures on their fortunes, they are unable to evade whether they were mobilized, if they were of the age demanding it, or that they didn't flee to Bordeaux with the government in 1917. If they admit they did flee they are held down and not allowed to speak further.

WHOLESALE SUGAR HELD TO 10 CENTS

Members of the United States Sugar Manufacturers' Association have been notified by Truman G. Palmer, executive secretary, that the Department of Justice would not increase the general maximum price of 10 cents per pound wholesale for sugar. He stated the department, in thus ruling, had no desire that any producer should sell below cost plus a fair margin of profit.
Producers charging more than 10 cents a pound wholesale will be investigated by the Department of Justice officials, Mr. Palmer stated. Producers, however, may sell to manufacturers at higher prices, provided valid contracts were secured to the effect that the manufacturers would not in turn increase the price because of the increased cost of the sugar content.
The beet sugar crop for this year, now being harvested, is estimated at 800,000 tons. It had weather conditions and the unusual fall of rain in the beet raising districts have decreased the sugar content in the vegetable.
FINDS BURIED SPIRITS.
CLARKSBURG, W. Va., Nov. 13.—Dr. J. Miller, who purchased the drug store of W. J. Horner, at Northwood a few days ago, discovered under the floor a "white horse" sign. 


