
Bolsheviks, After Fighting Deportation, Resigned to Return to Troubled Homeland.

NC-4, Cross-Atlantic Plane, and Commander, Lost Along Gulf Coast



The most famous aircraft in the world, the NC-4, as she appeared on the Potomac on her arrival some time ago in Washington, and her famous commander, Lieut. Comdr. A. C. Read, yesterday morning for Mobile, Ala., and is lost in a heavy fog along the Gulf of Mexico. Nothing has been heard of the plane since yesterday. The NC-4 was on recruiting duty in cities along the gulf, having left Washington about six weeks ago. After its recruiting trip the plane was to have been given a permanent resting place in the National Museum here.
