

HOW TO KNOW YOU ARE A VICTIM OF DEATH DRINK

NEW YORK, Dec. 28.—Dr. Royal S. Copeland, health commissioner, today called attention to the following symptoms of wood alcohol poisoning: First—Pain in stomach and weakness; nausea, followed by dizziness and headache. Second—Delirium. Third—Coma. As a rule, within three or four days after drinking wood alcohol, the patient will experience an eye disturbance. Sometimes this will lead to blindness.
