

DENIES REDS HARM CHURCH

Archbishop of Mohilev Says Bolsheviks Have Not Closed Places of Worship.

ROME, April 2.—The attitude of the Russian Bolsheviks toward the church was described today by Monsignor Deropp, archbishop of Mohilev and Catholic metropolitan for all Russia. "It is not true that the Bolsheviks have been especially hard on Roman Catholics," said he. "Nor is it true that they have closed up the Catholic churches or converted them into dance halls and moving picture theaters. The Bolsheviks deny any expression of religion, but they behave alike toward all spiritual creeds. "Four of my priests were shot by the Bolsheviks, but not because they were Catholics. There were political reasons why the men were killed. They were charged with aiding the anti-Bolshevik police. "Most of the churches in Russia are without priests, many having fled from the country. "Economically Russia is in chaos. I would advise the United States and the allies not to sink any money in Russia until civilized government is restored. Bolshevism is bound to go, I believe, but the process may be slower than some people imagine. I think that it will take about four years. "On the conclusion of peace and the demobilization of the Red army, I look for trouble throughout Russia. I believe that there will be local uprisings and sporadic revolutionary movements that will lead to a series of pogroms. Doubtless there will be wholesale massacres of Jews. "The advent of Bolshevism has not done any great harm to the Roman Catholic Church. The church is bound to reap great benefits from bolshevism disappears. "Monsignor Deropp has been in conference with Pope Benedict XV and Cardinal Gasparri, the papal secretary of state, on the Russian situation.

Frail Girl Tells Court Story of Seven Years' Torture by Relatives

NEW YORK, April 2.—John Gallander, thick set, two red-dish-haired, whose face and form show all of his fifty-seven years, gripped the rail before the magistrate yesterday morning in the New York avenue court, Brooklyn, while stories of unspeakable cruelties forced on his seventeen-year-old daughter Minnie, were read in the charges against him.

Continued assault was the formal charge made by the Children's Society against the father. As the hideous details were unfolded to the court Gallander, who has appeared in vau-deville as "Gallardo," swayed from side to side. No word came from his lips until the end, when his head dropped and he muttered, "Oh, God!" The arrest of Gallander at his home in Brooklyn was brought about after weeks of investigation by Assistant District Attorney Herbert McCormick; Mr. Harstedt, of the Children's Society, and Detectives Schlessler and Doherty.

Found in Street in 1918. The daughter, Minnie, had been in the care of the Protestant Big Sisters, The Children's Society, and the Jamaica Hospital in Jamaica, whence she had been carried one night in May, 1918, by the police, who had found her unconscious in Jerome avenue, Woodhull.

Stepmother New Dead. Soon after her father's second marriage, Minnie said, the terrible thing began to happen to her. Her own mother had died when she was a baby. The new wife became the mother of four children—Albert, now fourteen; May, ten; Dolly, nine, and Anna, six. Since Minnie ran away from home the stepmother has died of influenza and the father has married again, this time a girl of twenty-one. He has placed his children in a home.

Whiskey in Place of Food. When she was hungry and asked for food, her stepmother gave her whiskey to drink. She was moved from the home to another house in a trunk placed on a toy train engine and pulled by her stepbrother. A grave was dug for her in the cellar of the new house and several times a week she was led to it by her stepbrother, who pointed out the gaping hole in which, they said, she soon would lie. Any kind of torture that might offer recreation for her stepmother's own brood was forced upon the girl.

G. O. P. SPLIT OVER PAY FOR OFFICERS

House Republicans Divided on Wage Bill—Committee Favors Increase.

Republican forces in the House are approaching a bitter row over the question of whether naval and army officers should be granted an increase in pay. With the conference committee of the House divided equally on the question, because of the recent death of Congressman Browning, of New Jersey, one of the Republican conferees, Congressman Britten, of Illinois, now ranking member on the Naval Affairs Committee, late yesterday, was appointed as a conferee.

Britten, an avowed advocate of increased pay for the commissioned officers, is counted upon today to force the issue with Congressman Frank W. Mondell, Republican floor leader, and by his vote undoubtedly can cause a majority of the House committee to approve of the Senate provisions for increases in pay, at least to the naval officers, and more than likely for the army officers.

Mr. Mondell and the Republican steering committee at one time forced the House Naval Affairs Committee to examine a bill which provided increases in pay for commissioned officers. Then, when the Senate provided increases all down the line, Mr. Mondell announced that a conference committee would be appointed only when the commissioned officers were retired from their demands. BRITAIN'S POWER ON SEA DEFEATS H. C. L.

Survey Shows England Controlled Shipping Sufficient to Replenish Supplies.

England's supremacy on the sea, with its powerful priorities, has enabled her to keep prices of various commodities at a relatively low level. This opinion is expressed by American financial experts abroad, summarizing their reports to the Treasury Department today. In Great Britain the average price level is only 140 per cent above the mark five years ago, while in France and Italy the cost of living is an average of 250 per cent higher than in 1913.

This marked difference is explained partly by the fact that England controlled shipping sufficient to replenish her stocks quickly and at minimum cost. Hides have been obtained at less than current world market prices; wool was cheap until recently, and certain foodstuffs were likewise comparatively low in price.

NEW REVENUE CHIEF TO KEEP "DRY" PERSONNEL

Commissioner W. M. Williams, of the Internal Revenue Bureau, announced today that he contemplates no change in policy or personnel in the tax and dry law enforcement branches of the Government. Mr. Williams' statement is of vital concern to more than 15,000 men and women over whom he will have supervision and to business interests over the country. Mr. Williams' purpose to follow strictly the lines of the businesslike program instituted under the regime of his predecessor, Daniel C. Roper, who retired from public life to pursue a business career on April 1, came during an informal discussion of the bureau's affairs, at his first meeting with newspaper correspondents.

HAWAIIAN HOMESTEAD BILL TO BE ACTED ON The Hawaiian homestead land bill will be reported from the House Territories Committee within a few days. The bill provides for the cutting up into eight-acre lots of tracts of land aggregating about 176,000 acres, the lots being available to native Hawaiians for homestead entry similar to the public lands of the United States. There are only about 40,000 native Hawaiians, and one purpose of the legislation is the preservation of the Hawaiians, who are becoming extinct with alarming rapidity. The bill provides also a leasing system for the rich and highly-developed sugar cane lands not now owned by the sugar planters.
