For his latest Victor recording he has chosen "Your Eyes Have Told Me So," a song with a tender and yet catching melody, sweet-flowing harmonies and a refrain in waltz tempo that is irresistible. Every note is as clear and beautiful as a bell-tone, and the crowning high note, at the end, is possible only to a great tenor voice.

Persons familiar with Massenet's opera, "Herodias," will recall the passages of extraordinary beauty and sweetness in the aria, "Vision Fugitive" (Fleeting Vision). It is in this aria that King Herod, in delirium, tells of his hopeless love for Salome. Reinald Werrenrath, on a new Victor Record, sings the aria in a way that seems to accentuate the charm of the music without sacrificing any of its dramatic fervor.
