

GET TWO PAIRS OF SHOES AND BE ECONOMICAL

RUM RUNNERS ARE ACTIVE ON BORDER

Customs Officers Too Few to Cope With Many Outlaws Busy Smuggling.

ISLAND POND, Vt., July 12.—Hundreds of men, many of them armed and desperate, are engaged in smuggling liquor into the United States from Canada, according to customs officials here.

In a small weather-beaten customs office far from the usual haunts of travel, in a world apart, a world of forest, mountains and silent lakes, a steady-eyed, wiry veteran of many encounters with smuggling bands, told of the activities of the liquor runners. On every hand were woods, and the officer swept his arm outward as he said:

"This border runs for hundreds of miles like this, mostly forest, from here up around the State of Maine to the sea. We four officers here have our regular duties and on top of it are supposed to stop rum running. It can't be done. These woods are full of ruts. I know for a fact that gangs are smuggling liquor across the whole boundary.

"We do what we can—do all within our power, but there should be at least ten men on border duty alone. I think that customs officers are not able to handle the border work, for we know the border and know how to keep track on what is going on.

The liquor smuggled over the line to the great extent, is done in packs carried by groups of men, sometimes three and sometimes more. Ahead of the carriers a man marches alone to give a warning in case of surprise or signs of a suspicious nature.

"Sometimes when there is an unusually heavy traffic another man follows up in the rear. In some cases these men are armed, in others they are relying on their knowledge of woodcraft to circumvent capture. "In any event, it is a dangerous task. We have had a number of injuries, but the work is beyond the scope of the few men who are engaged in enforcing the laws about here.

Quebec is a dry country. The liquor smuggled over the line is in many cases contraband even in Canada. We have seized liquor which had neither the Canadian revenue stamp nor seal. Some of the liquor analyzed by our State authorities in Vermont was reported not fit for human consumption. While some sections of Canada have a local option to sell light wines and beers, throughout this section to the north the sale of whiskey is a violation of their laws as it is a violation of our laws.

FLOOD SEES DEMOCRATS AGAIN RULING CONGRESS

Virginia Lawmaker Declares Cox-Roosevelt Ticket Is Strongest in Field.

"With such strong men as Cox and Roosevelt at the head of the ticket, the Democrats will defeat enough Republicans in November to place control of Congress back in the hands of the Democrats," said Congressman Hal D. Flood of Virginia, chairman of the Democratic national congressional committee, in a statement issued yesterday.

"The Cox and Roosevelt ticket is a strong one looking at it from every angle," said Chairman Flood, who arrived in Washington today from San Francisco. "I served with Governor Cox in the House of Representatives and esteem him very highly. I have carefully watched his career since he left the House and am deeply gratified that he is now our Presidential candidate.

"On my way back from California and since arriving here I have met Democrats everywhere enthusiastic over the prospects for success in November for both our Presidential and Congressional tickets.

Chairman Flood expects to hold a conference with Governor Cox when the Democratic Presidential nominee comes to Washington in a few days and to go over plans for the Congressional campaign with him.

PACKER CUDAHY'S NIECE FIGURES IN ELOPEMENT

Marries Pasadena Bank Clerk After Exciting Flight Pursued By Relatives.

CHICAGO, July 14.—Edward A. Cudahy, Chicago packer, was surprised to learn yesterday that his nineteen-year-old grandniece, Edna Catherine Cudahy, had eloped from her home in Los Angeles and married Percy Fisher Browne, son of the late Francis Fisher Browne, founder of the Dial.

The news came in telegrams from Los Angeles this morning. The young couple fled in an automobile to San Bernardino, where they were married by a justice of the peace. Jack Cudahy, nephew of the Chicago packer, and father of the girl, with some of the relatives pursued the fleeing bride and groom in another car and arrived in time to stop the ceremony, but they didn't stop everybody's happy.

Browne, who is thirty-five years old, is a teller for the National Bank and Trust Company of Pasadena.

WOMAN ADMITS KILLING MAN WHO ANNOYED HER

GRANTSVILLE, Md., July 14.—Nannie Green is under arrest, charged with slaying early Monday morning Charles Gumbers, thirty-eight years old, South Brownsville. She says about midnight Gumbers came to her home and tried to get in. She secured a revolver and fired "into the ground" to scare him, she says. 
