LAND ISSUE STIRS JAPAN

California Planning to Bar Nipponese As Ground Owners. Special Envoy Coming.

Japan is prepared to make an issue with this Government on the question of land ownership in California, where a referendum measure forbidding Japanese subjects from owning or leasing agricultural land is practically assured of passage by popular vote on the coming Tuesday.

The Japanese ambassador, Mr. Shidehara, paid a long visit to the State Department yesterday. After a conference with Secretary Colby he continued his inquiries with Nelson Morris, United States ambassador to Japan, now on duty as Assistant Secretary of State.

It was later admitted by Mr. Colby that the ambassador's visit was due entirely to the California Japanese land issue. He expressed belief that eventually the matter will be amicably settled.

It was pointed out from another source that the crisis cannot be reached and met before the arrival in this country of Viscount K. Kano, a special envoy from the Emperor of Japan, now on his way to Washington from Tokyo.

So intense is public feeling, as reflected by mass meetings and the press in Japan, that the Emperor has sent Mr. Kano, who is a member of his privy council, to Washington for the expressed purpose of taking up the entire question of the right of an American Federal State to enact legislation directed solely against the nationals of Japan.

It is understood that Viscount Kano will conduct his work entirely independent of the embassy staff, and will devote himself exclusively to negotiations with the State Department officials on the particular matter of the California law.

U. S. ENTENTE WITH PERU IS FORECAST

Logical Step to Checkmate British Combination With Chile.

Efforts by Great Britain to regain on the west coast of South America the sphere of influence she has lost on the east coast and in the Caribbean sea will soon necessitate vigorous inquiry by the Department of State, it was stated by a high naval official yesterday.

It was pointed out by this official that a combination apparently exists between Great Britain and Chile by which the British expect to utilize that country as a base for their ambitions in the South American Pacific.

With this in mind, the official stated, the United States is clearly in favor of forming a similar entente with Peru. One symptom is found in the recent sale of the British battleship to Canada and several other warships, to Chile, while this country will be diligent in the sale to Peru of any naval ships that country may require.

GAS TANK BLOWS UP; 20 HURT, ONE FATALLY

DETROIT Mich., Aug. 29.—More than a score of workmen were injured, two so seriously they may die, when an acetylene tank at the Detroit Pressed Steel Company in the northeastern part of the city blew up yesterday. One man, Kent Sorenson, thirty, was blown two blocks from the factory and will die.

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U. S. DENIES HELP TO SUGAR SHARKS

Department of Justice Ignores Appeal of Dealers Who Held for High Prices.

'Sugar jobbers and other larger dealers, who loaded up on sugar at a high price, and now are losing heavily in a declining market, will not be aided in their efforts to recoup some of their losses by the Government's action on the appeal of dealers who held for high prices.

This decisive stand by the Attorney General, virtually a reiteration of the view officially expressed a week ago, but now couched in more positive terms, absolutely removes all hope the speculators might have entertained that the Government might jump in and through some "moral support" of the buyers, stave off heavier losses.
