Ogle had kicked the plaster off the wall, removed a lath, fashioned a heavy pin in hook shape on the end of a cord and could fish through the bars of his cell into another cell room, where a quantity of liquor, recently confiscated, was stored.

#### Lifer Pardoned at 72 Says He Will Start All Over Again

NEW YORK, Jan. 24.—"Old as I am, I will get a new start in life."

This was the creed voiced yesterday by Willett J. Springsteel, seventy-two, released from Sing Sing on a conditional pardon after he had served seventeen years of a life sentence. His home is in Pleasantville, N. Y.

Springsteel was convicted of killing his brother. A shotgun he was holding was fired at a closed door, on the other side of which his brother was standing. Warden Lawes interceded with former Governor Smith.

During his term in Sing Sing Springsteel was a model prisoner. Not one mark was entered against his record. He is an expert carpenter.

### GIRL PURSUES HER IDEAL MAN

#### Tourist Agent Followed From Europe by Miss Herbert, Determined to Wed.

PHILADELPHIA, Jan. 24.—Equipped with three large packages of cigarettes, Miss Beatrice Herbert, the tall, slender Canadian, whose exuberant fondness for William Zinser, assistant manager of a tourist agency, yesterday caused her arrest and still is causing that gentleman all sorts of mental stress, awaited immigration inspectors in Moyamensing prison today.

**LITHE AND POWERFUL.**

Miss Herbert is twenty-nine years old, dark-haired, lithe and powerful. Zinser, the object of her adoration, is thirty-five years old, rather small, mild and inoffensive of manner.

As she awaited the minions of immigration commissioner, James L. Hughes, to come from Gloucester for her, Miss Herbert maintained her defiant attitude. She had resolved to establish amicable relationships with "my American," as she fondly calls the harassed Zinser, and nothing, she declared, can avert her.

"Let them deport me," she said. "I will come back to my love again. He cannot resist my love forever. I will get him. He must eventually yield to me."

At his home Zinser took his stand against foreign domination. "The woman is talking utter nonsense," he said. "It is a hopelessly impossible situation."

That Miss Herbert must be deported under the law is certain. Commissioner Hughes said, provided the facts as presented thus far are correct.

"The law," he said, "prohibits a person deported from the United States from returning within a year. According to the report made, Miss Herbert was deported to Canada in September last year. If that is the case, the authorities have no choice but to send her back to Montreal."

**SCENE IN COURT ROOM.**

Before she was taken to Moyamensing prison Miss Herbert succeeded in "razzing" the police matron, Mrs. Mary Moore, until her patience cracked in several places.

During the hearing before Magistrate Macleary in Central Police Court yesterday afternoon Miss Herbert was removed from the room while Zinser was telling the magistrate how she had followed him, written to him and telephoned to him until his life had become a burden.

Mrs. Moore promised to ask Zinser to visit her in her cell if she would let the courtroom quietly. Trembling with emotion, Miss Herbert consented to go away from "my dear Will." After she had been held in \$1,500 bail, she called on the matron to produce "my loved one."

"He has gone," said Mrs. Moore. "He didn't want to see you."

"You have broken your promise," wailed Miss Herbert. "You told me you would persuade him to visit me in prison."

"Why bother about him?" said Mrs. Moore. "There are plenty more men. Go to Canada and marry a good Canadian soldier."

"You don't understand," said Miss Herbert. "There is no man for me except my Will. He is the ideal of my life, and the complete—"

"Complete fiddlesticks," said Mrs. Moore. "He is just like any other man."

"You don't know him," said Miss Herbert. "He is the most wonderful man in the world."

Meantime the "most wonderful man in the world" was telling immigration authorities his life would be blighted if "this raving woman" was not deported instantly.

**CLAIMS PERSECUTION.**

"She has persecuted me continually since she returned to the United States," he told the authorities. "She has written me the most outrageous letters and even invaded my office during business hours and made horrible scenes."

Miss Herbert was arrested Wednesday night by Taggart and Schwarz, detectives, as she waited for Zinser at the Ritz-Carlton Hotel. She gave the detectives a brisk battle.

Zinser said Miss Herbert first approached him two years ago, when he was conducting a party of tourists to China. She followed him to Japan and, after a short disappearance, boarded his boat at Hong-kong and resumed her attentions to the point where he had to complain to the authorities at Honolulu.

He eluded her at Honolulu, but she found his Philadelphia address and came here last September. After being deported, she told the police she returned to the United States two weeks ago by paying \$100 to be carried over the border. "I am well known, and to be pursued in this shocking fashion causes an irreparable damage," she also developed today that yesterday Miss Herbert had tried to commit suicide by jumping from the sixth floor window of the City Hall, but the matron caught her skirts and pulled her back.

**URGES HOME MEALS TO REDUCE PRICES**

PHILADELPHIA, Jan. 24.—Frank B. McClain, former lieutenant governor and at present fair price commissioner of the State, advocated more home meals as a means to bring down restaurant prices.

He made this suggestion after a conference with restaurant men, in which they refused to reduce prices in conformity with wholesale reductions.
