ASKS AID IN DRIVE FOR 33 MILLIONS

Methodists, With Baptists, Control South, Dr. Snyder Tells Roanoke Conference.

ROANOKE, VA., April 8.—Declaring that the South undoubtedly belongs to the Methodists and Baptists, the Rev. Dr. H. N. Snyder made an appeal before the Baltimore Conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church South for support in the \$33,000,000 campaign which the church proposes to inaugurate.

A recommendation of the board of education, read by the Rev. H. H. Sherman, of Front Royal, Va., that \$680,000 be assumed as the conference's quota of the church's \$33,000,000 education fund, was adopted at last night's session.

Dr. Snyder, who is assistant director-general of the campaign, said that the preponderance of numbers of the Methodists, with 2,500,000 members, and the Baptists, with 4,000,000 members, justifies the statement that the South in the future must depend on the Methodists and Baptists. He said if Methodism dies it will be because of the loss of evangelistic power. He said one object of the Christian education movement is to make religion more educational and to make education more religious. He said that, although a direct appeal will not be made before the latter part of next month, four \$100,000 subscriptions and a large number of smaller ones had already been made.

BIG SOVIET CONCESSIONS TO GERMANY REPORTED

LONDON, April 8.—A dispatch to the London Times from Berlin says it is understood that, in view of the imminent signing of a Russian commercial agreement, the financial group represented by Hugo Stinnes and August Thyssen already have acquired large concessions in various provinces in Soviet Russia.

The dispatch adds that it is reported the Soviet government is issuing permits to foreigners for the operation of branches of business which previously had been strictly forbidden.

How to Meet the Shortage of Dwellings in America

When the call came to feed starving millions across the seas, American generosity, efficiency, and foresight were not wanting. Now comes a call to provide shelter for a great nation without homes enough for its growing population—and that nation is the United States. In the largest city of the country, 100,000 families are doubling up with one or more other families; there are places in the city where twelve persons live in three rooms; where four persons sleep in a kitchen every night; and hundreds of rooms in which four or five persons sleep. There is tuberculosis and there have been isolated cases of typhus. These conditions exist and this description appears in a report of a committee of the United States Senate which calls for government action to help build homes for our people.


