The loot included four rings and a platinum wrist watch studded with diamonds, and a pocketbook containing \$5. A diamond brooch which was behind a photograph on the dressing table in Mrs. Brock's room was overlooked.

A call on a telephone in the room is believed to have frightened the thief away. So noiselessly did he work, Mrs. Brock, who was in an adjoining room, did not hear him. When Mrs. Brock entered the room to answer a telephone she found the window open. A search revealed the robbery.

FRENCH NATION TO HONOR NAPOLEON

Salutes to Be Fired in Paris and At St. Helena on Anniversary of Death.

PARIS, April 13.—A salute of 101 guns will be fired in Paris, and, with the permission of the British government, at St. Helena, at 5:19 o'clock on May 5 to call attention of the world to the 100th anniversary of the death of Napoleon. The salutes comprise only one of the details in a general observance of the date which has already commenced. Expositions at Fontainebleau, Compiègne, the Malmaison, and at Sevres were opened on March 15, and during April excursions will be made to Corsica, the island of Elba, Waterloo and the battlefields of France and possibly into the Rhine country.

There will be a historical congress of learned societies, to which the world is invited, to study Napoleonic institutions, especially the civil code.

On May 4 there will be a religious ceremony at Notre Dame, in Paris, at which Archbishop Dubois will be present, and an appreciation of Napoleon will be delivered by Abbe Henocque, the chaplain who holds eleven citations. There will also be a civil ceremony at the Sorbonne under the patronage of the President of the republic.

On May 5 there will be a military ceremony at the Arc de Triomphe where the "grogards" of Napoleon and the poilus of Foch will unite in homage to the Little Corporal, and Marshal Foch will deliver an address.

REDS RAISE EMBARGO ON TRADE IN MOSCOW

MOSCOW, April 13.—An official order of the Soviet government, published in the Pravda, makes effective the decree of the Moscow Executive Committee allowing free trade, not only in the bazaars, but in the shops as well.

Hereafter the population of Moscow will be allowed to sell goods for money and also to barter. The only restriction stipulated is that persons under eighteen years of age are forbidden to become merchants.

INSURANCE GOING TO GERMANY IS HELD UP

BUFFALO, April 13.—Justice Middleton, at St. Catharines, Ontario, has refused to allow money due on an insurance policy to be sent to Germany.

The amount—\$1,000—was paid into court by the New York Life Assurance Company, and it will remain there until the liquidation of Germany's war debts to Canada under the peace treaty is completed.

The money was the insurance on the life of Henry E. F. Stegman, of Massey Station, Ontario. One-third was for a brother, Albert, in Saskatchewan; the balance for two sisters, living in Germany.

The court paid the brother's share as soon as the money was placed in its hands.

ARGENTINE CROPS EXCEED LAST YEAR

Prosperity Visible on Farms, But Business Bad Because of Price Slumps.

BUENOS AYRES, April 13.—Persons who have been spreading the report that hard times are ahead for Argentina, based on a supposed shortage of exportable products, have been misled according to a writer in the Buenos Ayres Herald who has just completed a 1,000-mile trip by automobile through the heart of the most productive section of the country.

"In all the areas visited," says the writer, the "railway cars and sidings gave eloquent testimony to the fact that this year bids fair to surpass last year. Everywhere the bulk of the wheat and linseed is either safely housed on the railway premises or on its way. Alfalfa is abundant and oats above the average. Matize is already a man's height and as straight as a post."

"Fruit is abundant and cheap. In some places huge peaches are to be had almost for the asking. Never in the history of the country or the recollection of the oldest inhabitant who sits blinking in the door of his adobe hut, has nature been more liberal than this year. Signs of prosperity are manifest on every hand."

At almost every farm the traveler found an American automobile.

For the other side of the picture, the writer found business conditions bad as a result of the slump in prices. Merchants stocked with high-priced goods are having difficulty in disposing of them, he asserts.

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
