

**MAIMED GIRL GIVES SKIN TO SAVE FRIEND**

Ten-Year-Old, Without Arms, Ready to Throw Sunshine on World.

CHICAGO, April 28.—Rosie Saluka, ten years old, heroine extraordinary, will return to her home in Meadowbrook, W. Va., Friday, equipped with artificial arms and prepared to continue her smiling battle of life against odds that have sent many a strong man to his grave.

For some time Rosie has been the life and sunshine of the Salvation Army Rescue Home here, where she has been staying while having the artificial arms fitted.

Rosie was brought up in the dingy little mining town of Meadowbrook, and might never have been known outside that small community had it not been for the accident that all but cost her life. She took hold of a live wire at a mine entrance near her home, and when the sparks from the State Hospital arrived they found her skin charred from hips to shoulders and both arms all but burned off up to the elbows.

During an eight-month stay in the hospital, while surgeons were trying to patch up her little body, a girl friend was brought to the institution, also badly burned.

Rosie remembered that there were a few places on her legs that were not burned, and promptly gave enough of her skin to save the other little girl's life.

The Salvation Army workers found Rosie while still in the hospital and brought her to Chicago. In a few days, equipped with her metal substitutes for arms, she will re-enter the world to bring light to the down-hearted.

**SAYS NEWSPAPERS WILL BE SMALLER**

T. R. Williams Tells Publishers Trend Is Toward Better Papers, Higher Rates.

NEW YORK, April 28.—Indicating that the trend, owing to higher costs, is toward "smaller and better newspapers," T. R. Williams, business manager of the Pittsburgh Press, and president of the American Newspaper Publishers' Association, told the association's convention yesterday that such newspapers would have correspondingly higher subscription and advertising rates.

He said production costs never are likely to recede to the low point reached some years ago.

He warned publishers to beware of a sudden demoralization of the market tempting them to reduce rates temporarily, both in advertising and subscription, asserting they would lose all the constructive advantages gained during the war.

Williams asserted his belief that labor costs will remain probably permanently higher than before the war.

Abnormally high production costs, Williams stated, remained the publishers' chief problem.

"The average price of newspaper for the first six months of this year is higher than the average contract price for last year," he said. "Labor is at its very highest point known in the newspaper business, with further increase expected in some scales reported in the last sixty days. These are the conditions that prompted an experienced publisher recently to predict that many newspapers will become bankrupt this year unless they devise means of securing additional revenues."

Williams lauded the growth of co-operation among publishers to eliminate wasteful competition.

**KNEELS AT ALTAR AND AIMS BULLET AT HEART**

COLUMBUS, Ohio, April 28.—Kneeling at the altar in the chapel of Trinity Episcopal Church here Walter S. Schmidt, aged twenty, shot himself above the heart in an attempt at suicide.

He was rushed to a hospital, where he was said to be in a dying condition. Beside the altar lay a prayer book, opened at Psalm xxiv and beside it the smoking revolver Schmidt tried to kill himself with.

Differences with his sweetheart and the refusal of her father to permit him to see her were said to be the immediate causes for his act.

DETROIT, April 27.—The body of J. Walter Waisel, prominent Detroit business man, who with Fred Hemmeyer, another business man, disappeared December 4, while autoing, was recovered from a canal in Zug Island in the lower Detroit river yesterday. Hemmeyer's body was received two weeks ago.
