

STRENUOUS LIFE TAKES 1 MAN IN 5 IN MARYLAND

Health Chief Notes Big Increase in Diseases Due to Excessive Strain.

BALTIMORE, Md., Aug. 27.—One man in every five in Maryland dies from living too strenuously, it is revealed in statistics compiled by Dr. Frederick V. Bettler, chief of the bureau of vital statistics of the State health department. Death may be recorded as from organic heart disease, Bright's disease or affections of the arteries, but all three, Dr. Bettler says, can be classified as "degeneration of tissues due to overtaxation and prolonged strain."

In little more than a decade the yearly death rate from the three diseases mentioned has jumped from 22.34 to approximately 32 per 10,000 of population.

In these diseases, due to overtaxation of man's physical being, Dr. Bettler says, medical science has a formidable enemy, which must be conquered by education.

Business View Wrong.
"Business," said Dr. Bettler, "still thinks that the fellow who works himself to death at fifty is a good man. It doesn't realize that he is worth more, because of his riper experience and better judgment, if he works less hard and lives to be sixty-five. The same is true in industry; the man who lives longer producing more."

Comparison of the tables shows that organic heart disease, which caused 1,371 deaths in Maryland in 1909, was responsible for 2,248 in 1919. In the latter year it supplanted tuberculosis as the foremost cause, tuberculosis having led during all the other years. Percentage of total mortality for tuberculosis declined from 11.05 in 1909 to 8.26 eleven years later.

Bright's disease jumped from 6.54 per cent in 1909 to 8.76 per cent, and arterial affections from 1.02 to 1.29 per cent.

Typhoid Declines.
Typhoid gradually has declined and diphtheria, a prolific cause of death some thing over a decade ago, has dropped entirely from the list of principal causes. Meningitis is comparatively unimportant, Dr. Bettler says, and other epidemic diseases have been pretty well controlled. Cancer has increased, its fatalities jumping from 6.13 per 10,000 of population in 1909 to 8.62 in 1918.

Deaths from accidental violence, which Dr. Bettler holds of great economic importance because practically all victims are between fifteen and forty-five years of age, the most productive and potentially productive period of their lives, also have increased.

The figures also show deaths from pneumonia increased considerably in 1917, apparently foreshadowing the influenza epidemic of the next year. Influenza, which during the preceding nine years had a death rate ranging from 1.33 to 1.99 per 10,000 of population, leaped to a rate of 32.76 in 1918.

Telepathy Is a Myth to Science, Says Educator

LONDON, Aug. 27. SCIENCE finds nothing in telepathy, Dr. Forrest L. Dimmick, of Northwestern University's department of psychology, told summer students. "Sir Oliver Lodge's great reputation as a physicist cannot be stretched to cover his works in psychical research. "Tests have given no evidence of a faculty among normal individuals for receiving thought messages. In approximately 15,000 cases there is not a shred of evidence in support of the telepathic hypothesis."

CALL VIRGINIA U. C. V. TO MEET

Charlottesville to Be Host at Unveiling of Jackson Monument.

CHARLOTTESVILLE, Va., Aug. 27.—When it became known something like a year ago that the splendid equestrian statues of Lee and Jackson, presented by Paul Goodloe McIntire to the city of Charlottesville, would probably be ready for unveiling during 1921 the veterans of John Bowie Strange Camp expressed an earnest desire to have the Virginia Grand Camps of Confederate Veterans and Sons of Veterans hold their annual reunion here on that occasion.

It was early ascertained that the Lee monument would not be in place in time for unveiling in 1921, and that there was a possibility of its not being ready even in 1922. While this was a sore disappointment it was quickly decided not to wait on the Lee monument but to go ahead and invite the Grand Camps of the State to hold their reunion here this year upon the occasion of the unveiling of the Jackson monument alone.

That invitation has been extended for October 18, 19 and 20, and letters of acceptance have been received from Judge J. M. Mullen, of Petersburg, commanding the Virginia Grand Camp, U. C. D., Gen. W. E. Freeman, of Richmond, commanding the Virginia Division, U. C. V., and from Hon. R. Johnson Neely, of Portsmouth, commanding the Virginia Grand Camp, Sons of Confederate Veterans.

The principal feature of the reunion will be the unveiling of the Jackson monument on the second day, Wednesday, October 19. There will be at least five thousand people in the parade, including Confederate Veterans, Sons of Veterans, the Governor and his staff, the V. M. I. cadets, student corps of the University of Virginia, the American Legion, children of the public schools and various other civic and military organizations.
