


BRIDE, 15, SEEKS ANNULMENT OF HASTY MARRIAGE

Eugenia Bailey, After a Month of Wedded Life, Says Husband Deceived Her.

"Stone walls do not a prison make, nor iron bars a cage." So it is not to be wondered that Herbert F. Bailey, twenty-one years old, storned a summer school and by dint of passionate lovemaking backed by a newly-issued marriage license, influenced a fifteen-year-old girl student to marry him on August 9.

At least this is the charge made by the girl-wife, Mrs. Eugenia V. Bailey, today in a suit filed in the District Supreme Court seeking annulment of the marriage.

The Baileys' romance was a short and stormy one. Bailey, it is alleged, visited the girl, showed her a marriage license and told her that her mother had given her consent to their marriage, according to the citation.

Mrs. Bailey, represented by Attorney Campbell Howard, alleged that Bailey fraudulently represented to her that her mother had consented to the match, and that she, the girl's age as eighteen when she was 15 1/2, quite fifteen.

The defendant wanted to take his bride to Norfolk for a honeymoon trip, plaintiff avers, but she insisted on first returning home. There she learned her mother had not only not given her consent, but it is stated, would have prevented the marriage had she known about it.

Gaylor's Unable to Agree on Domestic Issues and Justice Names Figure.

A reconciliation not having been effected between Keith M. Gaylor, nineteen years old, and Harriet Tupper Gaylor, sixteen, his bride, Justice Hoehling of the District Supreme Court today ordered the youthful husband to pay Mrs. Gaylor alimony of \$40 per month until the trial of her suit against him for affirming their marriage and establishing her right to separate maintenance.

Several weeks ago Gaylor was before Justice Siddons on a motion of his wife to pay alimony, but the court at that time expressed the opinion that the youthful pair had not been sufficiently free from parental influences to get a fair start in life together. Accordingly the court refused the wife's request, suggesting that it might be possible for them to agree upon their views and to pay her numerous "in-laws." A stipulation filed yesterday by Attorney William J. Dow and Raymond Neudecker, counsel for the parties, stated that it had been agreed Gaylor was to pay his wife so much weekly during the period of their separation.

Mrs. Gaylor complained in her petition to the court that her husband had refused to enter their marriage developed a preference for the company of other women, and Gaylor, in reply, alleged that he could not get along with his wife's relatives, and that the youthful Mrs. Gaylor would not prepare his meals for him.

FRAT QUESTION TO BE SETTLED, BALLOU SAYS

Not to Be Allowed to Continue as Source of Agitation in High Schools.

The school fraternity question will be settled once and for all this year. It will not be allowed to continue as a source of agitation, Superintendent of Schools Frank W. Ballou indicated this morning.

The initial meeting of the board of education for this school year will take place Thursday at 4 o'clock. The inter-fraternity council has requested a hearing to plead for the restoration of fraternities in the high schools.

Superintendent Ballou indicated the publicity campaign, which the inter-fraternity council has been conducting, since the board of education issued a ruling last June prohibiting fraternities in the high schools, is far from pleasing to school authorities. It is common opinion in school circles that efforts of the council for modification of the ruling would have far better results if members had first taken up the question with the board, as it is indicated the board will stand by its rulings.

Ever since the board of education made its ruling, the fraternities have been in a constant fight for existence. Influential business men and Government officials have been enlisted by the fraternity men in their cause, and they believe their efforts show public sentiment is for fraternities.

Dr. Ballou refused to be quoted on the question until after the conference he has decided to grant a delegation of the inter-fraternity council this afternoon at 3 o'clock.

Armed with an array of questions, Louis A. Dent, local attorney, and Joseph MacGraw, spokesman for the business men who have taken an active interest, will ask Superintendent Ballou to explain why the board of education issued the ban on fraternities.

Lloyd George Receives Reply of De Valera to British Cabinet Proposal.

DUBLIN, Sept. 13.—Premier Lloyd George's proposed Irish peace conference will open at Inverness, Scotland, September 21. Sinn Fein leaders here believe The British cabinet's note of intent Wednesday had suggested September 20 as the date for the opening of the peace conference.

The Sinn Fein has begun to make preparations for the conference. The Irish delegates are expected to leave Dublin Monday, arriving in Inverness the following day.

By International News Service. CONSTANTINOPLE, Sept. 13.—Warfare in the Near East threatens to spread from Anatolia to Mesopotamia or the Kingdom of Iraq, as the district is known since Great Britain placed Emir Feisal upon the Mesopotamian throne.

The Turkish Nationalists are greatly alarmed over the prospect that British will send Mesopotamian Arabs to war against them. This would prevent the Turks from reorganizing their army which was shattered by the Greeks.

ASKS MANDAMUS TO GET HEARING ON REVENUE BILL. Marsh Declares "Prussianism" of Senate Committee Means Greater Unemployment.

By International News Service. Benjamin C. Marsh, executive secretary of the Peoples' Reconstruction League, announced today that he planned to institute mandamus proceedings in one of the District of Columbia courts to compel the Senate Finance Committee to hold public hearings on the revenue revision bill.

Marsh charged that the pending bill is "Prussianism" of the Republican party's campaign pledges; that it will increase unemployment, enhance the high cost of living, and be a serious blow to agriculture and other legitimate industry.

"We are making an effort," Marsh said, "to pry open the doors of the Senate Finance Committee, slammed in the face of the American people, and to compel the committee to give a hearing to the people whom they propose to doom to the heaviest taxes ever levied upon the people of such a wealthy country under the present circumstances.

"If this appeal fails we will try to get a court mandamus to prevent this nefarious revenue bill, sired by Wall street and undecid by the American people, from being voted out of committee without a public hearing. Prussianism in the United States Senate must be stopped."

OLD BAY RIDGE PROPERTY WILL BE DEVELOPED

Syndicate Buys Land to Construct First-Class Summer Resort.

BALTIMORE, Sept. 13.—Old Bay Ridge, on the Chesapeake, has been acquired from the Baltimore and Ohio Railroad company by a syndicate headed by Thomas T. Boswell, president of the Mineral State Coal Company, and his associates. Herman G. Odenwald, Thomas R. Bond and E. T. Boswell, according to an announcement made yesterday afternoon.

The deal, which has been pending for some time, was closed yesterday, and the property will be developed as a waterfront site for summer homes of the first class under the management of Messrs. Bond and Odenwald, a company for the development to be formed within a short time.

The project to build a large hotel on the site has been revived and the managers are in communication with hotel men in New York and elsewhere with this end in view. A year ago the plan of George F. Adams, manager of the Hotel Chamberlin, at Old Point Comfort, destroyed by fire two years ago, failed of consummation because of high building costs prevailing at that time. With building costs now at a lower level it is said there is little doubt that a handsome hotel will be erected on the site in the near future.

Overland connections with both Baltimore and Washington will be secured either by the relaying of rails on the old right-of-way between Lay Ridge and Annapolis or by the establishing of motorbus transportation between the two points.
