

# NAVAL FLIERS GIVE WAY FOR ARMY PLANES

### Sailors to Leave Soldiers to Own Devices for Bombing the Alabama.

The Navy Department today announced that naval aviators will not participate in the practice bombing of the old battleship Alabama, by army fliers, which will take place the latter part of the month.

Although invited by army authorities to send their fliers down, the navy heads feel that their department has fully demonstrated all that

they had contended, and that their exercises have been sufficient to justify their declining any further efforts at this time.


The Alabama will be turned over to the army today, and will be towed by the navy to a point near Tangier Island, in Chesapeake Bay, where the experiments will take place later in the month, lasting about ten days.

The army will avail itself of this opportunity, it is stated, to carry out its own plans, after having worked under navy schedules in the previous tests.

Under army plans, several days will be devoted to staging the army's own methods of attack. During this period gas and flame bombs will be tried for their effect on the personnel of battleships. Dummy crews will be placed aboard the target. Smoke bombs will be used to demonstrate methods of attacking vessels thus protected, as well as to experiment with their usefulness to the attackers.

Another feature will be the use of the new 4,000-pound high explosive bomb, provided these latter can be completed in time.

# SALARY FEATURE OF LEGISLATION TO BE DELAYED

### Reclassification Will Be Taken Up As Soon As Congress Reconvenes.

Reclassification legislation will be taken up by the Senate Civil Service Committee as soon as Congress reconvenes.

Senator Sterling, chairman of the committee, today announced that the report on reclassification would be ready for presentation to the Senate in a comparatively short time. It is probable that the revised edition of the original report of the joint reclassification commission will be adopted by the committee.

Members of the Finance Committee expressed doubt as to whether they will be able to take up the salary feature of reclassification for many months to come. The task of readjusting their work in connection with the functions of the Budget Bureau, and of initiating the re-employment program which has been decreed by the Administration, will absorb all the time of the Finance Committee during the coming special session, it is stated.

It is possible that reclassification legislation will be handled by the Senate entirely independent of the revision of salaries. The Senate Civil Service Committee may urge upon Congress the advisability of equalizing salaries in the various Government departments without undertaking a general revision such as was contemplated in the original reclassification bill.

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### CHARLES E. MARTIN SEEKS TO DIVORCE HIS WIFE

His wife has often told him that she had "a handsome young man friend who would pay for her divorce any time she asked him to do so," alleges Charles E. Martin, who today filed suit in the District Supreme Court against Grace Martin for a limited divorce and the custody of their children.

The husband, represented by attorney Oscar C. Thomas, avers that his wife repeatedly told him that she did not care for him; that she had all the men friends she wanted and that she could do anything she wanted with any man.

He alleges she is not "a fit person" to have charge of their children and he asks the court that they be given into his custody. The couple were married February 5, 1918, and have two children.

### N. Y. MAN TO HEAD A. A. A. WILL COME HERE SOON

Word was received here today from New York that D. L. Morgan, of New Haven, Conn., was elected executive chairman of the American Automobile Association to succeed A. G. Batchelder, of Washington, who was killed recently in an airplane crash.

# SEAMAN HEADS BLUE COAT CREW AT WHITE HOUSE

### "Larry" Gained First Experience as Executive Mansion Policeman Under Roosevelt.

Policeman E. M. Seaman, known as "Larry" by his friends, is now chief guardian of the executive offices of the White House while the squad of secret service operatives—

with President Harding, but it is nothing new to him as he began his service there during the strenuous days of President Roosevelt when a "copper" had to step.

During the absence of Detective Sergeant C. L. Dalrymple, who is nominally in charge of the police force in the executive offices, "Larry" is in command of the detail and has demonstrated his real courtesy and capabilities in a manner that has caused much favorable comment. His work has already received the commendation of President Harding, whose attention was called to the officer's affability and efficiency.

It is the duty of the officer in charge to be the first to meet and give the "once over" to callers, which include tourists, public officials, politicians, common pests, and oftentimes dangerous cranks. Hence it is necessary that this officer be endowed with unusual tact and "diplomacy," as well as a shrewd mind to cope with undesirable and not inadvertently ruffle the sensibilities of some individual who may have a peculiar notion of his or her importance.

"Larry" has the required qualifications to play this difficult role, say those who know, and he is essaying the part to the satisfaction of all. Assistants to "Captain Larry" are policemen Walter Scott Brady, Noble A. Beane, Frank B. Kelly, and Samuel Frazier, all "vets" who came to the White House during the Roosevelt regime.
