WAR CHEST OF KU KLUX UNLIMITED

Ex-King Kleagle Exposes Design to Make Victims Buy Own "Death Warrants."

Revelations of the methods of the Invisible Empire of the Ku Klux Klan even more astounding than those presented in yesterday's Washington Times are detailed today by C. Anderson Wright.

Wright, who resigned from the secret order "that rides in the night" after a threat on his life, he says, was one of those in the innermost circle of the Imperial Palace in Atlanta, and became familiar with all the plans, comprehensive and far-reaching, of the order.

First, he discloses a scheme by which, he says, Jews, Catholics, and foreign-born persons, under a new plan, are to be admitted part way into the order, but to some of its secrets, that plan being hit upon as a means of swelling the funds of the Klan and getting better "control" of the "enemy." Undying hatred of the members of these creeds was not to be abridged in any degree.

Second, Wright exposes the method by which he says the Ku Klux Klan evades the payment of a war tax on its initiation fees.

Tomorrow Mr. Wright will present to the readers of The Washington Times the story of the inside of the mystic Imperial Palace. He will tell what he saw and heard.

NEW YORK WILL BAR LEDOUX'S WAR SALES

NEW YORK, Sept. 15.—Police Commissioner Enright announced yesterday he would not permit Urban Ledoux to hold his advertised auction of unemployed here next Monday. He said it was unnecessary.

U. S. VICTIMS OF ZR-2 ARRIVE IN N. Y. TODAY

NEW YORK, Sept. 15.—The British light cruiser Dauntless, bearing the bodies of the sixteen American airmen who lost their lives when the dirigible ZR-2 exploded over the Humber river, near Hull, England, will arrive at the Brooklyn Navy Yard late today.

The Dauntless is being accompanied by American seaplanes and destroyers. The bodies will be taken to a special hospital building, where they will be surrounded by a guard of honor, which will stand watch until tomorrow afternoon, when naval services for the dead will take place.

AERO CHIEF ERIN STILL QUILTS POST UNDER FIRE

Major General Menoher Hands in Resignation Following Controversy With Assistant.

By International News Service. The discord and dissension which for months has been smoldering in the United States Army Air Service resulted today in the resignation of Maj. Gen. Charles T. Menoher as Chief of Air Service.

General Menoher has sent his resignation to the Secretary of War, it has not yet been acted upon, but it is understood that it will be accepted and the army air service will have a new head within the next few weeks.

Quits Under Fire.

Back of General Menoher's resignation is a record of months of session and discord over personnel matters which was featured in the months ago by General Menoher's manding that his first assistant, Brig. Gen. William Mitchell, the "flying general" in the army, be removed. General Menoher at the time sent a letter to Secretary of War Weeks demanding Mitchell's removal.

The Secretary of War mediated differences between the two officers at that time and the result was that General Menoher remained chief of air service and General Mitchell remained as his first assistant.

It was a "pitched up peace," however, and subsequent friction had not been removed. Recently it has become so pronounced that General Menoher's resignation resulted.

Menoher is Not Even a Flyer. The difficulties between General Menoher, who is not a flying officer, and General Mitchell, who is a flyer of note, first arose through Menoher's policy of putting non-flying officers in high administrative positions in the air service.

General Mitchell objected to this policy as detrimental to the morale of the service, and insisted that flying officers be given recognition in administrative positions. Their differences hinged on an interpretation of an article of the national defense act, which stipulates the number of non-flying officers in the air service.

The forecast was made by an authoritative source today that the following Irish events might be expected: 1.—De Valera will call a secret executive session of the Sinn Fein.

2.—Dail Eireann will order an immediate plebiscite. 3.—The voters, thanks to the powerful and perfectly organized political machine of the Sinn Fein, will return an overwhelming ratification of de Valera's position that Ireland must be treated as a sovereign state.

De Valera Calls Cabinet.

DUBLIN, Sept. 15.—Eamon de Valera conferred with the Sinn Fein cabinet here today in an effort to find a way out of the difficulties into which the Irish peace negotiations have fallen.

The first hint that the Sinn Fein will approach Premier Lloyd-George for a renewal of the peace negotiations was contained in a semi-official statement which was intended as a reply to the premier's announcement of yesterday.

PREMIER'S DEFI "CLEARED AIR," IS BELIEF—PLEBISCITE AT ONCE EXPECTED.

By International News Service. LONDON, Sept. 15.—"So far as we are concerned the peace negotiations are still in progress," declared Art O'Brien, Sinn Fein ambassador to London, today. O'Brien is head of the Irish Self Determination League and frequently acts as courier for the Sinn Fein cabinet at Dublin.

By International News Service. BELFAST, Sept. 15.—"The Sinn Fein never did have any will to make peace with England," said the Belfast Telegraph today in commenting upon the new sensational developments in the Irish situation.

LONDON, Sept. 15.—The door to Irish peace was nearly closed today. The action of Premier Lloyd George in calling off the proposed peace conference, while not ending negotiations between Eamon de Valera and himself has brought a possible renewal of Irish hostilities closer than at any other time since the peace discussions started.

Next Move Up to Irish.

The next move is up to the Sinn Fein. Leaders of Dail Eireann and the Sinn Fein cabinet were in conference at Dublin today and belief existed in official circles that the Irish would lose no time in replying to the communication which the premier sent to Dublin late yesterday.

British officials, while admitting that a new crisis has developed in the Irish situation, expressed the hope that the Irish moderates would prevent the breaking of the Irish armistice and would force a renewal of the peace negotiations upon a new basis.

In official circles the opinion was advanced that Premier Lloyd George, by cancelling the proposed peace conference, "had cleared the air."

Plebiscite Expected.

Sir Hamar Greenwood, chief secretary for Ireland, is expected to go to Scotland immediately to confer with the premier.

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WOMAN'S ESCORT SLAIN IN UNLIGHTED AUTO

AKRON, Ohio, Sept. 15.—Two men were arrested last night in connection with the murder at Richland, Ohio, early yesterday of Harry Sinclair, forty years old, Akron sportsman, as he sat at the steering wheel of his automobile. Their part in the tragedy is withheld.

One of the men gave the name of E. J. Fisher, who operates a cinder mill near here. According to Sheriff Hutchinson, Sinclair, with another man and two women, had visited the mill prior to the shooting.

Sinclair was struck by a bullet fired from a touring car, which came upon his auto with all lights extinguished.

REDS ORDER 830 SHOT FOR PLOT AGAINST SOVIET

Executions Will Take Place at Kieff, Report Says.

By International News Service. COPENHAGEN, Sept. 15.—The extraordinary commission of the Russian soviet has ordered 830 persons executed at Kieff for plotting against the Bolshevik government, according to a report from Moscow printed by the newspaper Politikon, today.

The report is not officially confirmed. Kieff is the capital of Ukraine.

HAYNES ORDERS PROBE OF STATE DRY MACHINES

Disheartened, Commissioner Plans "Clean-Up" — Wires Questionnaire to Directors.

By W. H. ATKINS, International News Service. Disturbed over the spread of liquor lawlessness and utter failure of the dry law machine to cope with it, Prohibition Commissioner Haynes today ordered a probe of all State enforcement organizations.

Commissioner Haynes wired a questionnaire to directors, which is expected to bring forth the most illuminating series of reports on Volstead law set-backs that it has been possible to compile.

The questionnaires ask the attitude of juries and the press toward prohibition, what progress has been made in disposition of seized liquor, and data on different phases of laxity in enforcement.

Commissioner Haynes is perplexed and disappointed. A wholesale "clean-up" of State enforcement organizations is expected.

Much of the demoralization is attributed to "systems" worked out between employees on the "inside," and illicit whiskey handlers on the outside.

SAN FRANCISCO, Sept. 15.—Ten special agents of the prohibition enforcement division were en route today to "Movieland"

They were sent on direct orders of Special Attorney General Robert McCormack, who ordered a complete investigation of conditions in Hollywood, home of the movies, and other motion picture centers around Los Angeles

State Agent Probes. E. Forrest Mitchell, State enforcement agent, is already in Los Angeles, and it is believed the orders of McCormack were issued following advice from him on conditions disclosed.

District Attorney Brady turned over at a conference with the Federal prosecutor all evidence he obtained with reference to the use of liquor at Arbuckle's gay hotel party here.

It was reported here today this evidence indicated that something like forty quarts of whiskey and a case of gin were consumed in the three days the Arbuckle party lasted. McCormack would not discuss the issue.

Federal prohibition enforcement officers are understood to hold that at least a part of this liquor was brought to San Francisco from Los Angeles in Arbuckle's automobile, in which he made the trip. Should this be substantiated, Federal officers said, the \$25,000 car would be seized by the Government.

"Spare No One." "No matter how high the investigation reaches, spare no one," McCormack told his agents today. "The guilty must be punished. The conditions must be so changed that another 'Fatty' Arbuckle orgy will be rendered impossible."

An indication that orders had come from Washington to ra thorough cleanup of the whole situation was seen not only in McCormack's activities, but also in the fact that John Exmiles, field agent of the Rockies for the national prohibition commission, also is on his way to Los Angeles to head a flying squadron.

Arbuckle was scheduled to do police court scenes almost exclusively today.

The attorneys for the heavy-weight film comedian fully anticipated this strenuous day "on location" in police court will result in the freedom of Arbuckle on bail pending trial on a charge of manslaughter for the death of Virginia Rappe, film actress.

Three Appearances. The rapid-fire police court scenes were to run something like this: 1.—Appearance before Judge O'Brien for dismissal of the original technical murder charge filed by the police.

2.—Appearance before Judge Lazarus to learn whether the State intends pressing the murder charge sworn to by Mrs. Bambine Maude Delmont. Although District Attorney Brady has given no intimation of his intention, it is expected Arbuckle will not have to face this charge.

3.—Appearance before Superior Judge Harold Lauderback to permit the fixing of the date of the manslaughter trial if the district attorney elects to press it instead of the murder charge.

Bail Money Up. Arbuckle will go free on bail as soon as the murder charge is dismissed—if it is dropped. His counsel, in anticipation of what they believe will be the district attorney's action, placed last night with the bond and warrant clerk of the Hall of Justice a deposit of \$5,000 cash and obtained a receipt for it.

Presentation of this receipt after dismissal of the murder charge will be sufficient to obtain his freedom on bail unless Judge Lauderback elects to boost the bail set yesterday by Presiding Judge Shortall in the Arbuckle case. This is not expected. District Attorney Brady, his several assistants, Chief of Police O'Brien and Captain of Detectives Matheson were in long conference last night and at the close of the conference Brady said no decision had been reached as to pressing the
