HAWAIIAN WARS FOUND SUBJECT TO REFERENDUM

Chief Receiving Challenge Fixed Time of Battle to Suit His Warriors.

By International News Service. HONOLULU, Oct. 22.—Evidence pointing to the development by the ancient Hawaiians of a remarkably advanced type of civilization has recently been brought to light.

In these modern days only prize-fighters, bullfighters and screen stars can stipulate the conditions under which they will fight and the time and place of the encounter; real fighters must still clash with the enemy wherever and under whatever conditions he may be encountered, even as their savage ancestors did.

Not so the ancient Hawaiian warriors! In those days when a chief or a king felt like having a good soul-satisfying scrap with one of his neighbors he did nothing so crude and uncivilized as to get an army together and try to take his enemy by surprise. Instead he sent his intended victim a little message, usually a black stone, upon receiving which the victim-to-be gave his army the casual once over, figured a liberal allowance of time in which to train for the fight and sent back an answer. If the time suited

the challenger a place was agreed upon, and on the appointed day and hour the two armies met and mixed it hand-to-hand, keeping it up until one of the two had nobody left to continue the fight. In this manner nobody had to fight if he happened to be enjoying life in peaceful pursuits, and, on the other hand, nobody had to go around long carrying a chip on his shoulder.

One of the most popular battlefields among the ancient warriors was an old lava-flow, just south of historic Kealahou, on the island of Hawaii, the scene of Captain Cook's violent death. There many a bloody battle was fought, and there the warriors who died in battle and were buried, according to custom, where they fell. The place is now a mecca for tourists and natives alike, recent discoveries of graves and implements of war having drawn many interested visitors.

CHICKENS SAVING KANSAS FARMERS FROM REAL RUIN

EMPORIA, Kan., Oct. 22.—Hundreds of chickens—of the feathered variety—are not earning their "salt," according to farm agents of several counties, who met in Emporia. Lazy chickens should be culled, killed and eaten, the agents declared.

While the stockyards corporations are shouting at the farmer to "hold" his livestock and the farmer finding a bearish market when he does ship it in, the barnyard hen has come to the rescue of the farmer. Chickens are the real "mortgage raisers" in Kansas the poultry men said.

Statistics show that the egg production in Kansas has increased fully one-third in the last two years.

But farmers who feed lazy hens are working a hardship on their communities and will save hundreds of dollars by getting rid of them, the county agents concluded.
