You can also, if you wish, cut out the squares A, B and C and place any one of them over any one of the faces on the strips, moving the squares up or down to get whatever effects in change of expression of which the "Funny Faces" are capable.

See if you can reason out for yourself just why it is that the same face looks so different when it takes up a different part of the cut out space in either of the A, B or C squares.

Directions

Cut out the two strips of faces on each side of the squares. Then cut out the three squares, A, B and C, and also the spaces in the squares marked "Cut Out."

Now take the strips and place them behind the squares so that their faces will show through the cut out portion. By moving a face up or down you can get a surprising variety of funny expressions in each one.
