

WOULD PUT BIG ARMIES TO WORK SAVING EUROPE

Major Watts, Engineer, Submits Plan to League of Nations for Consideration.

LONDON, June 10.—Europe rebuilt by Europe's standing armies—this is the plan that has been suggested to the League of Nations by Maj. A. D. Watts, former chief engineer of the Seventh Battalion Canadian Railway troops and now director of a steel corporation in England.

Major Watts declares that the standing armies of Europe are wasting a tremendous energy in maneuvers and drills and that if these armies were given the constructive task of rebuilding war-torn Europe the economical loss could be almost wiped out.

Wants Time to Work. "I cannot see disarmament approaching," Maj. Watts said. "The European nations must maintain small defensive armies, and if so, why should not those armies be used to increase the national wealth instead of being a burden?"

"It would not interfere with industry, because work on ports, harbors and forests that would be undertaken is work that no one else can afford to do."

"Take the case of France. Her ports are in a wretched state, the terminal facilities on her railways are bad, and there is room for great improvement in hydro-electric power."

"There is no reason, too, why her potash deposits should not be better worked."

military value of the standing armies would be lessened by their being used for constructive purposes, and he proposes that all troops shall have at least two months of intensive military training each year.

The armies would develop a high technical efficiency by undertaking reconstruction work. Maj. Watts declared, and he pointed out that the world war was really an engineers' war and 8 per cent. of the time of the armies was spent in engineering projects.

MARS COMING THIS WAY AT FAST GAIT

Will Reach Nearest Point to Earth, 42,500,000 Miles Away, June 18.

By Universal Service. LONDON, June 10.—British astronomers are preparing to study the planet Mars, which is traveling in the direction of the earth at the rate of 1,000,000 miles a day.

At midnight on June 18 it will reach its nearest point to us. At that hour it will be 42,500,000 miles distant. In the British Isles the planet will be only twelve degrees above the southern horizon. It will be easily recognized by its red, fiery color.

Dr. A. C. Crommelin, assistant astronomer of Greenwich Observatory and one of the most prominent students of stars in the world, told attempts to solve the mystery of the planet will be made this year.

"Both British and American astronomers will attempt to determine whether there is life on the planet," he said. "In Australia and New Zealand experts are also deeply interested. A party of enthusiastic astronomers is preparing to go to the Canary Islands to study the planet next month."

"The planet will be as close to earth as it ever can be on August 22, 1924," explained Dr. Crommelin. "At that time it will be about 34,500,000 miles away. That will provide an interesting period for investigation, but we hope to gain much more valuable information next month."
