LOVE-CRAZED YOUTH SHOOT GIRL AND RIVAL

Miss Ollie Hurst Dying Following Attack—Attorney Also Wounded.

By International News Service. KNOXVILLE, Tenn., Aug. 29.—Miss Ollie Hurst was probably mortally wounded, and George Reavis, an attorney, is in a serious condition today, as a result of having been shot down on the street late last night.

Police are searching for Frank Cotton, alleged to have fired five shots into the woman and attorney when he met them, because, police say, of a fit of jealousy.

Friends of Miss Hurst say she had quarreled with Cotton, who is well known locally, and when Cotton met her last night, he opened fire with this warning: "You can't play with me."

Reavis, who also operates a delicatessen near the scene of the tragedy, told International News Service he was in his store when the first shots were fired and ran to the sidewalk to investigate.

"The girl took refuge in my store," said Reavis. "She fell on the floor as the last shot was fired at her. Then Cotton opened fire directly at me, one bullet entering the lower abdomen, as you see."

Reavis, although weak, was very anxious to tell his story. A married man, about fifty years old, he denied emphatically he had any connection with the affairs of Cotton and the girl.

Miss Hurst was unconscious this morning and her condition is critical.

MRS. STILLMAN ON WAY TO CANADIAN RETREAT

MONTREAL, Aug. 29.—Accompanied by three men, believed to be newspaper reporters, Mrs. Anne U. Stillman, principal in the divorce suit brought against her by her husband, James Stillman, banker, is proceeding up the St. Maurice river by boat to Grand Anse, where the Stillman camp is located, according to a dispatch from Grande Pile, County Champlain, received here.

Bottling Plant Destroyed.

PITTSBURGH, Aug. 29.—One of the plants of the Atlantic Bottle Company at Brackenridge, near here, was destroyed by fire yesterday. The estimated loss is \$300,000. Several firemen were overcome by smoke.

SIMPLE LINES IN ALL NEW GOWNS FOR FALL WEAR

Little Change in Styles. Skirts on Evening Gowns Slightly Longer.

PARIS, Aug. 29.—Simple, youthful lines are scheduled to continue over into early winter. Fashionable Paris designers who have just begun to show their fall models say that the women like what has been dealt out to them in the fashion line this past season and they think it unwise to change, or at least for the present moment.

Skirts on evening gowns are somewhat longer and more draped than those of last season, but still not draped enough to lose their long, slender lines.

The Miller Soeurs are displaying a lovely model of royal blue crepe, which shows the new skirt length just scraping the ankles and an increasing tendency toward long, slim draperies. It has no trimming other than the belt, which is made of a series of small velvet leaves, each one lined with crepe. The sleeves are mere cape-like wings brought across the back and hanging from the shoulder. Sleeves and neck trimmings all have a trick of looking like a cape these days. The real cape itself is fast dying, so rumor has it.

The waist-line is a trifle higher, but still not normal. After all, the difference in these details is so very slight that any woman will have difficulty in finding a good excuse for not donning her last year's gown.

THIEVES LOOT HOMES OF BIG SUM IN BOOTY

Tailor Is Victim to Extent of \$1,700 in Materials—Other Thefts Reported.

Jewelry, clothing and other articles to the approximate value of \$2,500 were stolen yesterday by sneak thieves who broke into a number of Washington shops and homes.

Abraham Spivak, a tailor, 310 L street northwest, reported clothing and other merchandise, valued at \$1,700, were stolen from his shop. Detective Sergeant Howard Vermillion believes the thieves used a motor truck in carrying off the loot.

While Mrs. J. F. Gass, 1356 Girard street northwest, was absent yesterday, a thief broke into her home and stole jewelry and other articles valued at several hundred dollars.

John T. Hunt, 3321 O street northwest, reported to the police last night that a thief broke open a trunk in his room and stole \$400, part of his savings.

A gold watch, valued at \$35 and \$13 in cash was stolen from the locker of Jesse Shifflet, 1330 Tenth street northeast.

A typewriter, valued at \$50, was stolen yesterday from the apartment of Jack Xanter, 1926 New Hampshire avenue.

"WATCH ME DIE," SAYS BOY AND PULLS TRIGGER

CHICAGO, Aug. 29.—Playfully asking his chum to "watch him commit suicide," Jesse Grant, fourteen, put a revolver to his head and pulled the trigger. He died a moment later with a bullet through his brain.

The boys had found the revolver in a dresser drawer and "didn't know it was loaded."

COAL SHORTAGE MAY CLOSE COTTON MILLS

ATLANTA, Ga., Aug. 29.—Lack of coal will force the shut down of a large number of cotton mills in Georgia and the Carolinas within ten days or two weeks, it was asserted here today by P. E. Glenn, Secretary of the Georgia Cotton Manufacturers' Association.

Mr. Glenn said, however, that from 75 to 80 per cent of the mills in Georgia are operated by hydro-electric power.

Originator of Health Exhibit Urges Good Nature When Day Is Done.

Doc Wife was formerly just Friend Wife, but the health expert of the hour has declared a wife's peevish smile better medicine than ten bags of drugs. The speaker, Marjorie Martin, originator of the first national standardized health exhibit, which will open in October, said that the exhibit would stress the medicinal qualities in a woman's smile as well as in pills.

"The wife can make or break the health of the nation, and incidentally, the health of her husband," said this officer of the Safety Institute of America and other health organizations. "And this is how the exhibit will tell her she can do it."

"At the end of the day when the husband comes home, make a contract with yourself covering your evening's behavior.

Smile at Dinner.

"For heaven's sake don't spend the dinner hour mournfully relating to your mate every misfortune of the day."

"Your home is your office just as much as your husband's office is his; and at the close of the working hours, stop business, close shop, be sociable.

"If you are a business woman, you should be able to appreciate the strain on a person's nerves and vitality during a long day at the office."

"Remember that your husband's physical strength is about spent at the end of the day; that his nerves will scream out if his vitality is drained much more; that his health will break if his vitality is worked out."

"Be pleasant, be patient, be forbearing and indulgent."

"Although you may enjoy moping, remember no one else enjoys seeing you."

"The promotion of health is more important than the prevention of the cure of diseases."

"Remember recreation should be spelled with a hyphen—re-creation. That's what it means, a re-creation, not just killing time."

"Re-create your husband—don't run his nerves in the ground."

Do Your Duty.

"Do your duty, and the doctors won't have so much to do."

"The Chinese have a wonderful system. They pay their doctors as long as they keep them well and stop their salary when they get sick. You be the Chinese doctor of your household."

WIFE OF NAVAL OFFICER MISSING AFTER HIS DEATH

PHILADELPHIA, Aug. 29.—After the death of Commodore S. Taylor, chief medical officer at the Philadelphia navy yard, his wife, Mrs. Barbara Taylor, forty, disappeared from their residence in the Government reservation and has not been seen since.

A party of sailors under command of a senior lieutenant has searched the marshy sections of the yard and other places in a vain effort to find her. If she is not found the river will be dragged.
