In the Register of yesterday we find this editorial statement: "The cost of the War Department, as stated by Radical authorities, was \$12,000,000 last year."

Now it will be seen that none of these can be properly considered expenses of the War Department. Five-sixths of this sixty-six millions were arrears of the war.

A striking feature of the foregoing exhibit is the relatively small amount actually required for Southern reconstruction expenses only a little over a million and a half for the military.

These figures are from the official statement of Commissioner Wells, published in our issue of the 1st inst. We wish our Democratic friends would study some of the military figures they undertake to talk about the Government expenditures, and then either tell the truth about them or refrain from telling the reverse.
