River News. The river is on the decline with fourteen and a half feet in the channel. Heavy ice has been running all day. The weather has moderated considerably.

The Major Anderson left on time with 3,000 kegs of nails. All the local packets left on time.

We copy the following from the Cincinnati papers of yesterday: The river fell 6 inches more yesterday, in consequence of the extreme cold weather, and during the night there were 38 feet of water in the channel, and 64 feet space under the bridge.

The R. R. Hudson, from Wheeling, had a good trip down. She shipped 1,300 kegs of nails and some other freight on the Robert Burns, for Memphis, 500 kegs of sugar, for the same place, and 100 kegs for the interior, and had some for New Orleans.

The Coal Hill en route from Pittsburgh to Cincinnati, with a tow of coal, broke her shaft at Murrayville, W. Va., Sunday.

The Edinburgh was purchased on Monday by Capt. Frank Y. Batchelor and others, from Mr. S. N. Fowler. Report said the price paid was \$15,000, but we believe Capt. B. drove a better bargain. The Edinburgh will carry between 500 and 600 tons of freight. She will leave here for New Orleans, Wednesday morning, and in the meantime, will get all the freight she wants.
