THE HARRISVILLE MEETING.—We would remind the Council that a meeting of the friends of the Wheeling & Toledo Railroad is to be held at Harrisville, about eleven miles from the city, next Saturday, and we would suggest that a committee be appointed by the Council to-night, composed either of members of the body, or citizens, or both, to attend that meeting to show our Ohio neighbors that Wheeling feels an interest in the success of the enterprise.

Falling outward it set on fire a bed immediately below. An alarm was given and the Department was soon on the ground. The flames were extinguished before much damage was done.
