THE IRISH QUESTION.

Irland under the Tudors and the Stuarts—Second Lecture by Father Burke in Reply to Mr. Froude. (From N. Y. Times of Friday.) Mr. Burke delivered the second of his course of lectures, last evening, at the Academy of Music—subject, "Ireland under the Tudors and Stuarts." Mr. Burke said that the period which the lecture dealt with was the most terrible and calamitous in Irish history. Mr. Froude had stated that "Henry VIII. was a hater of disorder." Well, said Mr. Burke, every man has his hero—every man selects some character of his own which he admires, and makes the subject of his hero-worship. But Mr. Froude made a most singular selection of his hero in Henry VIII. the English Nero. All order is based on three grand principles—respect for law, liberty of conscience, and the sanctity of the marriage tie. The lecturer then proceeded to sketch the various salient incidents of the reign of Henry VIII., tending to prove that the monarch was not remarkable for a very prolific. Was it fair, asked Mr. Burke, for Mr. Froude to come before an enlightened American audience and ask them to swallow the paradox that Henry VIII. was a lover of order?
