THE FASHIONS.

NEW YORK NOVELTIES. Overshirts are sadly short of their dimensions, says Harper's Bazar, and appear oftenest as mere aprons, half over-shirts and intricately draped saashes. There are, however, many plain round overshirts still shown, while others have their simple shape destroyed by capricious draping, which makes each side different; for instance, the left side will be caught up to the belt by a bow and saash ends, while the right falls in a long deep point, finished by tassels. To complete the diminished overshirts saashes are necessary, and these need not be of silk, but of wool or linen, like the dress or the trimmings. They are two double lengths of different lengths, made along the edges. Bases are growing longer, and are more often slashed in the seams instead of being plain. The fronts have two soft points, and are double-breasted; fanciful collars and revers are much used; the back is still elaborately trimmed; two buttons define the waist behind. Sleeves are easy coat shape, with square cuffs, or close fit up the outer seam.

The suit which will probably "take" best is the sleeveless-jacket suit. This costume is so graceful and stylish, so suitable for spring fabrics of two shades or of contrasting colors, so easily made, so well adapted for both houses and street, and, above all, offers such practicable plans for remodelling old dresses, that it will likely to be the standard style for spring and summer.
