It is a notable fact that all public men who opposed the war of 1776, 1812 and the war against the Democratic rebellion were never afterwards honored, with one exception, by an election to the Presidency. After the first war, to prove the charge of Toryism against a candidate for any office was equivalent to his ruin. The war of 1812 was opposed by quite a number of politicians who were afterwards stigmatized as "Blue-Light Federalists," and only one of them, James Buchanan, was ever elected to any important position. He owed his elevation to the fact that the pro-slavery oligarchy needed a pliant tool who would aid them in their traitorous designs. Democratic opposition to the war for the Union has caused the defeat of every candidate who has since run on the ticket for the Presidency. McClellan, Seymour and Greeley were all three defeated, though the last was a staunch Union man. As a leader of the anti-war party in 1861, Mr. Tilden may read his doom in the fate of the Tories of 1776, the Federalists of 1812 and the Copperheads of 1861.

The Revival of Business.

All the movements indicate a marked change for the better in business circles. In a previous article we referred to the causes operating in this direction. 1. Good crops in the West. 2. Small stocks of goods in the hands of manufacturers, jobbers and retailers. 3. The extreme low prices that had been reached. 4. The crops are now secured, and the aggregate result of the harvest is most encouraging. 5. A more abundant harvest in the West and South. The Eastern States, owing to the drought that prevailed in that section, are not nearly so well off as the West, nearly all the crops having fallen largely short. Hay, corn, and potatoes are almost entirely failed. This will result in a large loss to the West, and will afford a large outlet for our surplus products. Europe will also continue to buy largely. The crops in England are not up to those of 1875, and the latter were below the average. In consequence of the scarcity and high price of feed for cattle, American corn is being largely used. This will cause a largely-increased foreign demand for our staple Western product, and will insure fair prices where comparatively low figures were apprehended. This will be beneficial to farmers, and also to railroads, and it to the prosperity of the farming classes that we must look for a solid improvement in business.

Returning Prosperity to Ireland.

No one who has seen the famine-stricken Ireland after an absence of some years can have any doubt that she now has made considerable advance in material prosperity. Evidence of the fact is borne in upon him in a multiplicity of ways. The prosperity is not such as the country enjoys, but of its kind it is real and considerable. It has been attained through terrible sufferings that reflect discredit on our statesmanship and our intelligence, but now that the suffering is past it is some consolation that it has not been undergone altogether in vain. The great emigration which followed the famine has diminished competition for the land, has brought the population within the limits the wages fund can support, and in short has made the general condition tolerable. If that was all, the prosperity would be unsatisfactory indeed. In the middle of the last century there was a famine as grievous as that of '47, and yet the beginning of the present century saw the population outgrowing the means of subsistence. If there were at present, then, no more than a reduction of numbers, we might well be content with the result. In many respects, there is a positive advance. In every department merchants are looking up instead of looking down, and now the aim is to increase rather than to diminish stocks. This is strengthened by the low prices that have been reached. In most classes of manufactures, values were below a producing point. This has been the cause for some time past. It forced, of course, a reaction in the volume of production, but the effect was not felt until the demand from consumers revived. It is felt now, and the consequence is increasing confidence, which extends from the consumer to the manufacturer, and altogether it looks as if the turning point had been passed, and the long looked for revival of business was upon us. And this is likely to continue because it is based upon a pretty solid foundation. There is nothing spasmodic about it. It is not the result of speculation, for there has been no speculative feeling in the country. It comes from the operation of the natural laws of trade—supply and demand meeting—and now that the shrinkage has been taken out, there is no likelihood of a reaction. The general appearance of things in the city corresponds with the views herein presented. There is a marked increase in the volume of life and activity. It has been observed that our streets never presented a more lively appearance at this season of the year than they do now. The prospects for a heavy and paying fall trade are certainly most encouraging.
