The Vote of Yesterday.

The vote of the city yesterday was about 60 per cent of a full vote, which was all that could be expected considering the fact that there were no candidates for office mixed up with the issues of the canvass.

As was expected, Clarksburg leads largely for the Capital, although Martinsburg comes up with a decidedly larger vote than we anticipated.

The vote from the various counties is not full enough at this writing to enable us to form an intelligent estimate of the result in the State.

From the returns before us, we have no doubt but that the P. W. & Ky. subscription has carried. It is largely ahead in the city, and although a three-fifths majority is required in its favor, yet we have no idea that the city's three-fourths majority below the necessary three-fifths vote.

Five Weeks of Burning.

WASHINGTON, August 7.—Morgan, Drexel & Co., bankers of New York, are advancing money to officers of the army in the absence of a regular appropriation for their pay, and are charging them interest on sums advanced at the rate of six per cent per annum.

Another Life Insurance Company Unsound.

CHICAGO, August 7.—The Auditor of Public Accounts filed a petition in the Circuit Court yesterday, stating that the condition of the Protection Life Insurance Company was such as to render its continuance in business hazardous to the assured, and praying an injunction against the company transacting further business, and the appointment of a receiver.

Germany and Austria in Conference.

NEW YORK, August 7.—A dispatch from Berlin says: The Empress of Austria and Germany met near Jelen on Wednesday last, and had a conference, which was very important.

Receiver Appointed.

St. Louis, August 7.—Judge Grotzschalk, of Circuit Court, this p. m. appointed L. E. Alexander, formerly Cashier of the Mercantile Bank, Receiver of the Columbia Life Insurance Company of this city, that institution having been declared insolvent.

SAN FRANCISCO, August 7.—The twelfth Industrial Exhibition at Mechanics' Institute opened to-day.

FOREIGN NEWS.

The Porte Deals in Horrors.

LONDON, August 7.—The Porte has issued a circular recounting the horrible massacres perpetrated by the Cossacks and Bulgarians. These include the burning alive of seventy Mussulmans in the village of Ayvalik and the cold-blooded massacre of 40 others, as well as women and children.

Refuge to Pay Taxes.

ATHENS, August 7.—Many villages in the district of Valo have refused to pay taxes. The Turks have placed six gunboats before the gates of Valo and threaten to bombard the town on the first sign of insurrection.

Insurance Ended.

LONDON, August 7.—The Russian insurance is at an end. The insurgents are crossing into Dalmatia. The Russians are concentrating in great force on the Lora river. An attack on Ragrad is thought imminent.

England.

LONDON, August 7.—At the Conservatory demonstration at Laidfield yesterday Lord Salisbury in a speech made the following reference to the Government's foreign policy: We earnestly deprecated this war. We are allies and friends of both contending parties.

France.

PARIS, August 7.—In obedience to instructions of the Prince Imperial, Baron de Sereilly will run for Chamber of Deputies in Ajaccio, against Prince Napoleon.

Italy.

ROME, August 7.—Daffare is disposed to form a ministry of conciliation with the aid of the Left Centre and Moderate Right, as recommended by Moniteur.

TERRE HAUTE, IND., August 7.—Dr. J. Barnstrom, a leading physician was shot and killed in a northern suburb of this place, at 9 o'clock to-night. He was returning from a visit to a patient in the country. The cause of the murder is a mystery.

Adjudged Insane.

CHICAGO, August 7.—In the trial of Prof. Pike for the murder of S. S. Jones, of the Delta Philosophical Society, in March last, the jury this afternoon rendered a verdict of acquittal on the ground of insanity. Papers were read showing that defendant had been an inmate of the Taunton Lunatic Hospital, of Massachusetts, and also of the Insane Asylum at Blackwell's Island. Pike was remanded to jail to await transportation to the Insane Asylum.

Mexican Affairs.

GALVESTON, August 7.—A news special says that Lieut. Bulls crossed the Rio Grand on the 4th and recaptured five stolen horses and returned to Texas on the 5th. Major Schield arrested four of the Valdez filibusters at Eagle Pass. Valdez himself was at Laredo and a warrant was issued for his arrest, but he escaped. The Escabedo party are at Laredo without funds.
