The President interviewed on the Subject of the South.

The National Republican of Washington, in an editorial interview with the President on Tuesday, on the Southern situation, says:

"In answer to a question as to whether the Southern policy had been discussed in the Cabinet, the President is reported to have said: 'That is a mistake; the time has not yet come for a discussion of the subject for anything but the most determined and vigorous action. The determination was reached several days ago, and the deliberations of the Cabinet on this subject since then have been comparatively unimportant and confined mainly to the consideration of the duty of the Attorney General in the premises.' The President has always thought that his policy would win back the South. He was asked how he accounted for the result in the election, and he replied: 'I have nothing to say just now. But it appears that the leaders who made those pledges either did not exert themselves to keep them or were unable to do so. In fact I am extremely sorry to admit that the experiment was a failure. The first election of importance had since it was attempted, has proved that free elections, with free suffrage for every voter in the South, is an impossibility under the existing condition of things.'"

General Sherman's Annual Report.

WASHINGTON, D. C., November 12.—General Sherman has submitted his annual report to Secretary McCrary. In it he refers to the reports of the different commanders of the Military Departments, and invites particular attention to that of General Sheridan. His command, says General Sherman, embraces eight of ten regiments of cavalry and eighteen of twenty-five regiments of infantry, which compose the entire army, and although he states this force to be entirely inadequate for the Indians, it is impossible to further reinforce him without stripping the seaboard or abandoning other territories subject to the same dangers.

The Freedmen's Bureau Funds.

WASHINGTON, November 13.—Second Auditor of the Treasury French, in his annual report, quotes from his late reports in regard to the funds discovered by the War Department in payment of claims by the sub-agents of the Freedmen's Bureau prior to the transfer of that Bureau to the Department and the responsibility of the Freedmen's Bureau. It was found that the sub-agents had received from the Treasury Department a total of \$1,121,000, of which \$1,000,000 was paid to the Freedmen's Bureau, and \$121,000 was retained by the sub-agents.

The Auditor says: I have now to state that the cases against the late Commissioners have been brought to an issue, and judgment rendered against them to be had, looking to the relief of these colored people, who claim to have been defrauded of their bounty money. Congress must take the initiative, either by passing upon the report of the Freedmen's Bureau, or by making the requisite appropriations and empowering the accounting officers to resettle the claims after it shall have been clearly established that the claimants have neither received the full amount of their bounty nor derived any benefit therefrom.
