the Pacific to New York, and the exclusion of all other lines as far as they contribute to swell the trade of New York, is but another effort in the same direction.

Having excluded the other trunk lines from New York, and having compelled them to demand the same rates from the West to their cities as is asked to New York, to what condition will these lines be reduced?

The Culture of Ginseng. "Ginseng" is a famous herb in West Virginia, and not a few of our people in the interior make a considerable part of their living by digging it. It quotes as high, at points like Weston and Buckhannon, as \$150 per pound.

The Chicago Tribune, after having watched the contest, not only for months past, but for years, has come to the conclusion that the present fight is a fight for the undisputed commercial supremacy of New York as against all rivals, more particularly Philadelphia and Baltimore.

The Baltimore and Ohio and the Pennsylvania Railroad represent respectively the cities of Baltimore and Philadelphia, and the West equal in all things to the rates on the Vanderbilt lines between the West and New York.

The Union of the Gould and Vanderbilt syndicates indicates that all questions of what the outcome of this railroad struggle must be. The Pennsylvania and the Baltimore & Ohio Railroads will be compelled to abandon all competition with New York, and further be compelled to make their rates between Philadelphia and Baltimore and the West equal in all things to the rates on the Vanderbilt lines between the West and New York.

There are certain obstacles in the way of the completion of this work, but that they will be removed in due time there can be no doubt. One of these is the construction of the new Midland route from, say, Buffalo or Salamanca to Chicago and St. Louis, of which route the Erie Railway and its connections are an essential part to connect with New York.

The ownership of a controlling interest in the Erie Railway is a mere question of money. Those who offer the best terms will find the unfortunate and long-suffering stock and bond holders of that road ready and willing to sell. It has been a long time since a company for a generation. It has been robbed and plundered time and again by its managers, and is now so borne down with debt as to be unprofitable to the stockholders.

New York City is unquestionably the natural harbor for the foreign trade of the country. It is the natural gateway through which we must ship all we have to send and through which we must receive not only all we buy, but the vast army of immigrants, who arrive at the rate of 2,000 or more every day. It is the only port at which a foreign steamer can be maintained. Steamers must find employment at both ends of the route. Nine-tenths of the foreign passenger traffic of the country even now finds its way in and out of New York. The city has the capital that controls, and has the natural capacity and advantages for a commerce tenfold greater than it is called upon to accommodate.
