They demand more vigorous measures for unearthing the property of the dodgers. They say, and tly too, that if all citizens should make fair returns the rate of taxation could be reduced, and so the burden lightened upon all. As it is, the burden is increased upon the honest portion of the community and lightened upon the dishonest. A premium is thus offered for dishonesty. The honest man has no other consolation than the approbation of his own conscience. He carries about with him the reflection that he is

One reason why so much personal property escapes taxation is that the men appointed to list it are incompetent for their work. They are not experts but nevices. They know very little about the status of property owners in the community. They are green in the business in all respects. They do not know how to go about discovering the property they are required to assess. All their information is of the most superficial character. They are often not even acquainted with business matters, have no familiar. ness matters, have no familiarity with investments and are easily put off with any sort of a return. Many of them cultivate popularity at the expense of their sworn duties. They like to stand solid with every tax payer whom they approach. This is their primary object. Consequent ly they only skim over the field and in numberless instances never get below the

All this delinquency and dishonesty on the part of the assessors falls at last upon the well-meaning portion of the commu-nity. The State, the county and the city get their taxes, as a matter of course, but the constant tendency is to cut deeper and deeper into the bona fide taxpayers. No matter who pays the taxes, the public und to have enough, let it come from the many or the few. If one rate of taxation will not produce the required amount, then an additional rate vill be put on next year, and a further rate the year after. The taxes must come from some source. We have an illustration of this in the law just enacted by the West Virginia Legislature for a reassessment of the real estate of the Commonwealth. It is simply an indirect method of raising the rate of taxation. If this method does not produce the required amount of revenue then the next step will be a direct increase in the rate.

There are economists who hold that all taxation should be levied on real property, and that this taxation would distribute itself among the owners and renters of property. This is not a fair argument, however, as a millionaire might live in a house worth \$20,000, and his tax on this property would represent a very small portion of the tax that he is justly entitled

to pay.

The fact is that there is no fairer theory of taxation than the present system, which aims to lay the burdens of government on property, where they are fairly entitled to rest. But the difficulty is to get at person al property. If we had experts in assess-ments—honest, fearless and intelligent men-at least twice as much persons property would be listed in every city,

would be lighter on the whole body of the people. But the puzzle of all writers or the subject is to devise a plan by which ex pert assessors can be secured. There is n eatent way of either securing the right men for assessors or implanting honesty in the natures of tax payers. But in view of the necessities of the case there ought to be very effort made to reach more satisfactor esults than have been obtained. On great help to this end would be for the county authorities to publish a list, jus after the listing season is over, showin every man's return. This ought to be done every year. It would cost very little and yould greatly stimulate correct returns.


