The Hon. William H. Duncan, who died at Hanover, N. H., last week, was graduated at the head of Dartmouth's class of 1830, among the thirty members of which were Judge Gouverneur Dorr, of Michigan; Judge A. M. Peck, of California; President A. D. Smith, of Dartmouth; and Prof. J. B. Niles, of Indiana. He was married to Miss Sarah M. Olett, a sister of the wife of Rufus Choate, and was for many years an intimate friend and associate of Mr. Choate and Daniel Webster.

But the apparent increase in 1880 was due entirely to more complete returns of deaths, and even the figures of that year cannot be regarded as accurate. Except in a comparatively small number of communities vital statistics are not gathered in the United States after a scientific plan.

The actual mortality of the United States is probably somewhere between 18 and 19 per thousand, instead of a little over 15. But that is a low rate as compared with European countries, the death-rate for the whole of England having been 20.5 per thousand in 1880, and for Scotland, 21.3 in 1878.

Of the 790,893 deaths recorded in the census returns, 640,191 were of whites, out of a total white population of 43,402,070, and 146,702 of negroes, out of a total colored population of 6,752,813. The apparent death rate, therefore, was 14.74 among the whites, and 17.28 among the negroes.

Prehistoric Remains in Germany. A discovery which is expected to throw some light upon prehistoric times in Germany has been made near Andernach, on the Rhine. Remains of prehistoric animals have been found in a punice stone pit, and Professor Schaffhausen, of Bonn, has investigated the spot closely, and has ascertained that the punice stone was laid bare, showing a width of only two meters. The crevice between the blocks of lava were filled with punice stone to a depth of one-half to one meter; below this, however, there was pure loam and clay, and in this were found numerous animal bones, apparently broken by man, as well as many stone implements. It is supposed that there was a settlement there, of which the food remains fell into the lava crevices before the whole was covered with punice stone.

A Battle in the Grass. A fight between a rattlesnake and a black snake was recently witnessed near Fort Worth. The black snake forced the rattlesnake, gliding around in swift circles while the rattlesnake lay coiled.
