MARTYR PRESIDENT.

The Great Sensational Roorback. About the Remains of Lincoln being Taken to the Tomb—What the Custodian of the Ashes Has to Say About It—His Boss Safe from the Hyenas—The Sealed Tomb.

SPRINGFIELD, Ill., November 15.—The statements in a sensational dispatch from this city published in Chicago this morning to the effect that the body of Abraham Lincoln were removed from the sarcophagus shortly after the attempted desecration and have never since recurred there, is not true. The State Register a short time ago sent an inquiry to J. C. Power, custodian of the monument, asking: "Where are the remains of Mr. Lincoln deposited at present, and are they turning to stone?" Mr. Power wrote a long card in reply, which was published, giving a history of placing the remains in a leaden casket in a cedar coffin in the sarcophagus, and the sarcophagus in the monument, where they remained undisturbed till the attempted desecration of November 7, 1870...

DEVILISH DEEDS.

Four Englishmen Assaulted. In Paris for Defending a Dejected Stranger—A Man Struck to the Heart Knocked His Assault Down—A Vengeful Struckman's Avenge Act—Wrecking a Train for Spite.

PARIS, November 15.—The recent affray on the outer boulevards of Paris have now been followed by a cruel attack upon four respectable English mechanics, whose only offense was that they interfered in the absence of the police to save the life of a man who was being barbarously maltreated by four ruffians. It was for this kind of ruffianism that the celebrated "Recidivists' bill" was enacted. The following are the details of the case as related by eyewitnesses and the Secretary of the Mairie of the Twelfth Arrondissement: Shortly after half-past eleven, on Monday night, four Englishmen, named Pope, Hoge, Bowers and Forstner—the last being a British subject, though German by extraction—were playing billiards in an upper room used nightly by the police for the purpose of receiving the ruffians, a dark, narrow street leading to the Faubourg St. Antoine. The Englishmen, who were from the Swan United Electric Light Company's factory, had chosen this place because they had recently been told elsewhere they were often mistaken for French people by Germans. While the game of billiards was tranquilly proceeding an alarm was raised in the street. The Englishmen rushed out and found four ruffianly looking men on the stairs. One of them, a tall, dark man, named Weiss, who was trying for some time to mediate between the ruffians and the police, was dragged into the room, where he declared his assailants had called him a Prussian, and had threatened to kill him. The second and most vicious part of the drama began. The Englishmen waited quietly at the door, while in about five minutes, Weiss's assailants returned, and before any defense could be made, attacked and stabbed all four of the Englishmen. Pope, who did not know that the knife of one of the ruffians had pierced him close to the heart, actually knocked the fellow down and then sank upon the ground with the blood pouring out upon the pavement. The ruffians immediately took to flight, and the Englishmen were left in the billiard-room and laid upon the table upon which they had been playing a quarter of an hour before the attack. They were subsequently removed to the Hospital of St. Antoine, and thence to No. 32 Avenue de la Republique, where they were treated. The second and most vicious part of the drama began.
