This is the stand that ought to be taken by the tax-payers of every county. They ought to present a solid front to the unlawful edict of the State administration.

The Supreme Court is "solid" in political agreement with the party which has done this thing for its own purposes; and it has been announced, with great flourish, that three judges of that court, being a majority, acting with the Democratic caucus, have approved the order.

Let us see whether the court will stand by the caucus edict. If so, the people may see fit to get at the matter through a constitutional amendment and the overthrow of Bourbon management.
