DEATH OF MR. HUGHES

AN OLD AND PROMINENT CITIZEN. Died suddenly at his home on the Island of Appley - A Long and Honorable Career among Wheeling Business Circles Ended by Death at a Ripe Age.

The many friends and acquaintances of Mr. Thomas Hughes, head of the well known merchant tailoring house of Thomas Hughes & Co., were shocked yesterday morning to learn of his sudden death, which occurred at 5 o'clock yesterday morning at his home on South Front street, Island.

The deceased was in his sixty-fourth year, but looked like a much younger man. He was among the oldest residents of Wheeling, having been born in the city November 2, 1821, at the corner of Main and Eighth streets, where the family long resided.

From 1873 to 1884, Mr. Hughes was a resident of Baltimore, where he was connected with the extensive cloth dealing house of Robert Moore & Co. Before and since that period he was a resident of Wheeling from his birth.

Belfont Iron Works. - March 6. Have 115 machines running, including 14 self-feeders. Heating furnaces and nail plate rolls on double turn.

Norton Iron Works. - March 8. Have 110 machines, heating furnaces and rolls in operation.

La Belle Iron Works. - March 10. Have 37 machines running.

Benwood Iron Works. - March 10. Have 7 machines running.
