The police protection with which he is surrounded is very objectionable to him, and he suffers it only at the special request of the Empress. A ruler who knows that by uttering the one word "constitution" he can save himself, and who yet leaves that word unspoken because it is incompatible with his dignity and with the welfare of the people, is certainly not a mervous coward. 
