Madam Anna Keim, of the South Side, testified for the defense. She said that she had known O'Neal for many years; the girl became an inmate of her place and made the acquaintance of "Pudgens" O'Neal, who was her lover up to the time of her marriage with Clark, which took place January 1, 1885.

Mrs. Keim told O'Neal what Clark had said, but the latter only laughed and said he would be ready to defend himself, and give him credit for it.

A month or so after Clark moved to Elm Grove Mrs. Clark got into trouble in the city and spent one night at Mrs. Keim's.
