WASHINGTON, D. C., June 21.—The following is the President's letter presenting his jubilee congratulations to Queen Victoria:

GREAT AND GOOD FRIENDS.—In the name and on behalf of the people of the United States, I present their sincere felicitations on the arrival of the fiftieth anniversary of the birth of Her Majesty Queen Victoria of Great Britain.

On the procession near the Abbey the troops saluted, guns fired, the bells of the churches rang out merry peals, and flags were run up, the cheering being continued until the Queen had passed into the west door.
