THAT BREWERY BOYCOTT. Mr. Schumbach Gives the Company's Side of the Pending Controversy.

A reporter of the INTELLIGENCER yesterday saw Mr. Schumbach with regard to the boycott declared by the Wheeling Brewers' Union.

Mr. Schumbach said: "In the first place, there is hardly one fact in all the statements published. There were not four men working in the cellars; there were but three. Of these one desired to remain in the wash-house, and would not join with the other six. With regard to staining ice, four were discharged for that offense, and because of their discharge two more quit. It is not true that they were in the habit of picking up the ice that had been used on uniforms. They took a few pieces of ice, scattered them and watched their chance to remove them secretly. They were seen by people in the neighborhood. They had not been discharged on Monday, but on Tuesday afternoon. The men discharged for this cause have never been seen by me about it. They knew they were guilty, and I suppose that no business concern would be expected to allow that kind of thing to go on unrebuked. From this source springs the boycott, and for the reason that I have given. It is easy to see that the statements made by the men who stole our ice have been colored to suit their own purposes, and to do us harm, as much harm as possible. I think when the facts are known the public will see on which side justice lies. That is all we ask."

A VERY LIVELY SESSION

Of the Board of Education Held Last Evening.

THE CHOOSING OF TEACHERS

For the Ensuing Year Reviews an Old Dispute—The Annual Levies, a Change of Text Books and Other Matters Come Up.

The regular monthly meeting of the Board of Education last evening was one of the most interesting since the well-remembered series of interesting and sensational sessions the Board held in the summer of 1887, when the trouble was had over the appointment of two teachers for the Ritchie schools. Last night the annual confirmation of teachers came up, and once more there was an interesting discussion over the nominations for the Ritchie schools. Dr. Pipes and McCoy were the principals in the discussion. The matter was finally compromised. Another matter of interest, over which there was a long discussion, was the proposed changes in text books.

THE ANNUAL LEVIES. The Committee on Salaries recommended that the salaries of teachers and janitors for the coming year remain the same as last year. The committee stated that they deemed it inadvisable to make any advances over the scale in force the past year on account of the present indebtedness of the Board and the heavy expenditures which must be made in consequence of the erection of the new Madison school building on the island.

THE SALARIES OF THE JANITORS OF WASHINGTON, Webster and Madison schools were raised from \$25 to \$30 per month. All the other salaries of the janitors were the same as last year. It was also ordered, on the recommendation of the committee, that to teachers who have taught less than ten months in some grade shall be paid.

The total estimated expenditures out of the School fund aggregate \$70,885, of which \$30,885 will be required for the coming year, the same as last year.
