Going to Extremes.

The "Law and Order League" cannot count upon being sustained by public sentiment so long as it causes the arrest of poor widows who keep the wolf from the door by selling bananas and oranges on Sunday.

If they confine their crusade to such violations of the Sunday laws as are demoralizing in their effects and are outrages on public decency they will be upheld by all good citizens, but some of the methods they have resorted to make cases against inoffensive people are not calculated to help their cause.

It is a true fact that when a poor woman sells a banana on Sunday at the request of a "Law and Order detective," she violates the strict letter of the law, but she is no more guilty of offending the moral sense of the community than is the detective himself, who buys the banana in order that he may go before a court and prosecute her.

Indeed, she has rather the best of the case, for she receives public sympathy while the "detective" receives only public contempt for his petty action.

If the "Law and Order League" really has the good of the community at heart, and earnestly desires to stop the Sunday almon business, it will not handicap its own work by going to such extremes.

The soda-water fountain and the harmless refreshment stand are not luring the youth of the city to ruin, and when open on Sunday do not shock the moral sensibilities of the Sunday pedestrian who finds them a public convenience.

True, they are not the "works of mercy and mercy" which the law excuses, but at the same time they do no particular harm. The Law and Order League, however, does not seem to be blessed with a discriminating genius. The result of following the course begun will be the defeat of its purpose, and the Sunday almon business as before.
