A MUSHROOM STATESMAN

On the 12th of May, 1891, the Cleveland Democratic Club, of Buffalo, opened a new club house, and the Hon. Grover Cleveland, its patron saint, made what our neighbor, the Sun, would doubtless call the "consecration" speech on the occasion.

It was one of those characteristic speeches of his on Democracy with which the public is somewhat familiar, in which he starts out with the impressive statement that true Democracy means the greatest good of the greatest number, and proceeds to hammer it out and spread it thin and embroiler it with phrases and use up his vocabulary on it, until at the end of half an hour the bewildered hearer has reached the conclusion that the greatest number is Number One, and that the duty of the Democratic party is to make his greatest good its constant aim.

He told his hearers that they had already done "valiant service in the campaign of education," and was "surrounded by the trophies of victory," and in closing said: "Let us, then, as we push on our campaign of education, especially impress upon our countrymen the lesson which teaches that public extravagance is a deadly, dangerous thing; that frugality and economy are honorable; that the virtue and watchfulness of the people are the surest safeguards against abuses in their government, and that those who profess to serve their fellow-citizens in public places must be faithful to their trust."

These remarks are not particularly striking or original. They are supposed to relate to the circumstances that the appropriations made by the Republican Congress which it was the chief merit of Mr. Cleveland's administration to bring into power were denounced by Democrats as excessive. The final clause is in the nature of reiteration of what he considers the first principle of genuine Democracy, that no one but Grover Cleveland ever did or ever can administer public office as a public trust.

The entire speech is reproduced by the New York Times and is pertinent to the criticisms which have been passed upon the present Democratic Congress by Democratic newspapers and public men because of appropriations more extravagant than its predecessor. Our contemporary commands it, the attention of Democratic members of Congress as a strong appeal for economy at a time when their action shows that they are in danger of falling into the wasteful and extravagant ways of their opponents. And no doubt it is thought that the republication of this speech just now, when so many Democrats are criticizing Congress for extravagant appropriations, will be a help to Mr. Cleveland as a candidate at Chicago. The idea is that the campaign of education is still on, and that Mr. Cleveland is still the leading pedagogue. A year ago he was holding up what he called the "Billion-Dollar Congress" as a solemn warning against "a deadly, dangerous thing." The "campaign of education" had been carried on against it, and the Congress now in session was one of the "trophies of victory." The educators are puzzling over its appropriations; just at this moment, wondering where the education comes in.

Now, there is certainly a campaign of education going on all the time. But it is not Mr. Cleveland's kind of education. That gentleman makes a considerable mistake when he puts on school-master airs and undertakes with a few trite phrases to educate the American people up to something he thinks he has found out. He is a mushroom statesman, with a great many things to learn himself, and shouldn't take himself for a sunflower or a banyan tree. His notion appears to be that he somehow stands for a date; for the beginning of a period; for a new departure, a new dawn, or something or other in the calendar, and that the country must be educated up to him. Lots of things have been learned by the people while the campaign of education has been going on.

They have learned that all the professions of the Democratic party are empty and false, that it has no convictions on the tariff or silver, that it has but one governing principle—to steal whatever it can lay hands on—that with all its infusion of Mugwumpery and worship of Stuffed Prophets it is the same old concern, without honesty or capacity, an "organized appetite," held together by the cohesive power of public plunder. And right here in New York they have learned that a governor and legislator advocated by Grover Cleveland on the stump and enthusiastically supported by the Mugwump press, are about as bad a lot of dishonest politicians as could be got together. There is where the "campaign of education" comes in.

Commissioners to Madrid.

WASHINGTON, D. C., May 23.—The President to-day appointed Admiral Stephen B. Luce, U. S. N. (retired), to be commissioner general, and Prof. G. Brown Gowd, assistant secretary of the Smithsonian Institution, and Prof. James C. Wellington, president of the Columbian University, to be assistant commissioners to represent the United States at the Columbian historical exposition to be held in Madrid in commemoration of the 400th anniversary of the discovery of America.
