

TWO SHORT ROUNDS

In the Garbage Controversy Were Fought Last Evening.

CARNEY AND BECKER PART EVEN.

Second Branch of Council Again Votes Favorably on Becker's Bid, but the First Surprises People by Refusing to Concur and Voting for Carney's Bid of \$13,000—A Very Complex and Uncalled for Condition of Affairs.

First Round in Second Branch—Becker again lays out Carney. Carney got in eleven good boys, but Becker goes in three better with fourteen.

Second Round in First Branch—Carney comes up smiling and confident. Hot in-work—Carney out. Becker lands five times, but the sixth round breaks down Becker's guard seven times.

Third Round—Next week in both branches. The result in doubt.

Last evening a specially called meeting of the city council was held for the purpose of considering the garbage collectorship. After the action taken at the last meeting, when Charles Becker got the contract at \$12,100 in the face of the health board's recommendation of William Carney at a higher bid, \$13,000, it was discovered that Becker had not secured the contract legally.

In that the law requires that when the successful bidder does not receive a two-thirds vote of council, a majority must be given to two successive meetings. This is the situation that called forth last evening's meeting.

It was stated before the meeting that the matter had not properly come before the first branch at the last meeting of council, for the reason that the second branch had not passed on the matter—only one majority vote had been given Becker.

It was therefore necessary for the second to give Becker another majority, and for the first either to give him a two-thirds vote, which would dispose of the subject, or a simple majority, in which case it would be necessary for that branch to again give him a majority at its next meeting.

On account of the effort of several bidders in addition to Becker and Carney to secure the contract, there was an unusually large proportion of the membership present. Mayor Caldwell presided in the upper branch's chamber and President Waterhouse in the second. Twenty-three second branch members were present when the roll call took place.

The president stated the object of the special meeting, and Clerk Thoner read the health board's resolution giving the contract to William Carney. Mr. Maxwell moved that the necessary second vote on Becker be taken.

Mr. Wheat wanted to know why Becker is picked out when there are lower bids than his. If the gentleman who moved that Becker be given the contract would explain, he could vote intelligently on the subject.

Mr. Kenny said a thorough examination had been made by the health board and they had picked out Becker and Carney, and as Becker was the lower bidder of the two he had moved that the contract be given Becker.

A vote was taken and resulted as follows: BECKER WINS AGAIN. Ayes—Bachman, Brock, Brill, Britt, Dinger, Deiters, Hamilton, Israel, Kenny, Knick, Maxwell, Milligan, Zoelcker, Zwicker—14.

Noes—Burke, Filan, Gruse, Hupp, Killeen, Krieter, O'Malley, Robertson, Warneke, Wheat, Waterhouse—11. Mr. Brock moved adjournment, and

the garbage collectorship matter was taken over to the first branch. Here Mr. Hadlich moved concurrence in the action of the second branch, and it was defeated, as follows: Ayes—Dobbins, Hadlich, Haller, Otto, Richards—5.

Noes—Caddie, Caldwell, Irwin, Kalbitzer, Menkemeller, Robinson, Weidbusch—7. Mr. Irwin moved the matter be referred to the health board. Mr. Richards said the board has already dealt with the matter, and there is nothing to be gained in that direction.

He favored action by council at once and finally. It is incumbent on those who voted in the negative to propose a measure to get council out of the muddle. He moved Irwin's motion be laid on the table, and it was defeated, as follows: Ayes—Caddie, Dobbins, Otto, Richards, Robinson—5.

Noes—Caldwell, Hadlich, Haller, Irwin, Kalbitzer, Menkemeller, Weidbusch—7. Mr. Irwin withdrew his motion, and Mr. Menkemeller moved to adopt the original report of the health board, giving the contract to Carney.

Mr. Richards moved to postpone action until the next meeting and the motion was defeated 5 to 7.

A vote was then called on Mr. Menkemeller's motion. Captain Otto remarked that Becker is as competent as Carney, and he claimed it due the taxpayers of the city not to sacrifice \$900 by giving the contract to Carney. He took it the health board had outrageously recommended a high bid in preference to a lower one.

Mr. Menkemeller claimed experience in the past proves the city cannot be cleaned for less than \$15,000, and he considered the recommendation of the board should be approved. Carney, too, had promised the roadway to the crematory shall be put in good shape at his own expense.

A MATTER OF A ROAD. Captain Otto took it this latter circumstance should show that Carney would be getting too much. Mr. Menkemeller said the repairs to the road would only cost \$100.

Chairman Caddie said the bondmen of other bidders were as good as Carney's. Preceding he said Carney had been decided upon unanimously. This road to the crematory, he said, is now in good condition. He would favor a low bidder so the city shall save as much money as possible. The conditions are such any contractor will have to do the work satisfactorily. He only supported Carney as the board had unanimously agreed on Carney. He had been tempted to bring in a minority report.

Mr. Haller moved the report be referred back to the committee, but Mr. Menkemeller's motion, the mayor said, had precedence.

Mr. Richards spoke of Chairman Caddie's remarks, and thought it out of place for a member to plead for the adoption of the report, who has spoken against that action. He wanted light from the chairman of the board, and he may not want to speak in council, and for this reason he thought it proper to refer. If the \$9,950 man (McCracken) is reliable he should get the contract, and he can't be kept out of it. It must be shown he is not a good bidder. It is not business or common decency to make an election out of this matter.

Mr. Menkemeller's motion was then called up and a vote taken as follows, giving the contract to Carney, as far as the first branch was immediately concerned: Ayes—Caddie, Caldwell, Irwin, Kalbitzer, Menkemeller, Weidbusch—7.

Noes—Dobbins, Hadlich, Haller, Otto, Richards—5. The mayor considered it high time for council to come to an understanding, and wanted speedy action. A motion was made to adjourn, but Mr. Otto wanted to know what it is the intention to do.

It was called to the attention of the mayor that the resolution as amended must pass, and it was adopted by the same old "seven-five." It was decided that the matter should lay over until the next meeting of council when the first branch will again vote on Carney and in case another majority is given, the matter will come over to the second branch.
