ARE HAULING WATER. Crocks, Springs and Wells Going Dry in the Country.

THE DROUGHT SEEMS TO BE GENERAL. And has no Precedent in Recent Years—Big Wheeling Creek's Bed is Actually Dusty in Places—The Crops, also, are Drying up, and Berries Fall for lack of Moisture—Great Need of Rain in this Valley.

There has not been a time in recent years when there was a greater need of rain in this vicinity than just now. Not only are the growing crops injuriously affected by the drouth, but the streams are drying up and wells and springs running dry.

Fords in Big Wheeling creek at the Marshall county line, where at the lowest recent stage six inches of water ran, are now actually dusty all the way across, and there are pretty long stretches where the bed of the creek is as dry as the pike beside it.

The river is not yet down to as low a stage in proportion as the crocks, but the supply of water comes from far up the valley. Judging from the reports from headwaters it is destined soon to beat the record.

In Wheeling creek there are few fish left except craws, and on the muddy bottoms these can be picked up almost as large as young lobsters. A good drenching rain would do a world of good just now, in the city and country alike, and a really expert rain-maker would not have to travel far in Ohio or Marshall county to secure a lucrative situation.

TO-DAY'S CONVENTION. At New Martinsville Promises to be a Lousier—Delegates Enroute.
