ALL THREE KILLED.

The Murderer Steals Into the House While the Woman Was Preparing Breakfast and Opened Fire on Her and Her Uncle. He Then Went Upstairs and Shot Himself Dead.

Philadelphia, August 8.—Jealousy caused a sensational triple tragedy in this city this morning. William N. Evans, of 4634 Willow street, Frankford, a suburb of this city, shot and killed Louis Hecht, at the latter's home, 1214 Montgomery avenue.

Evans, who is said to have been a shiftless sort of a fellow, was employed at Green & Bault's dye works, Frankford. Because of his worthless character his wife left him six weeks ago and went to live with the family of her uncle, Louis Hecht.

Evans, who had been seen hanging about the neighborhood late last night, gained entrance to the rear part of the house by an alley which runs off Twelfth street.

He then went to the middle room in the second story, and placing the revolver to his left breast, sent a bullet through his heart.
