Gloriously Redeemed From the Party of Free Trade.

SHE RETURNS TO HER FIRST LOVE

After Having Been Astray for More Than Twenty Years.

FREE TRADE WILSON DEFEATED

To All Appearances and Dayton is the Hero of the Hour.

DOVENER'S SPLENDID MAJORITY.

He Rolls Up Over Two Thousand Huling and Warren Miller Elected and the Legislature Will be Republican on Joint Ballot—Protection to Home Industries What the People of the Mountain State Want—A Great Wave of Protection Enthusiasm.

West VIRGINIA voted for protection yesterday beyond a doubt. The returns indicate that all four Republican candidates for Congress are elected and that the legislature will have over 20 Republican majority on joint ballot.

The great free trade leader, William L. Wilson, has been defeated by the gallant young Alston Gordon Dayton, by a big majority, which is not yet known.

Captain Dovener is elected by fully twenty-five hundred over John A. Howard (Dem.) Ohio county, so many years Democratic, gives 1,700 majority for protection. It was a Democratic Waterloo everywhere in all sections of the state. Warren Miller and Huling, it is believed, are both elected.

West Virginia has the distinguished honor to be the first to break from the solid south.

WETZEL COUNTY
Indications That Howard Will Not Have Over 500 Plurality.

Special Correspondence of the Intelligencer.
NEW MARTINSVILLE, W. VA., Nov. 6.—We have partial reports from six voting precincts in the county, which indicates a larger Populist vote than was expected, and nearly a corresponding falling off in the Democratic vote. If this condition obtains all over the county, Howard's majority will fall below 500.

LATER.
One precinct in Grant one in Greene and two in Marlinton give Howard forty-four majority. We are still of the opinion that Howard's majority in the county will not exceed 500. Ankrum (Republican) in the delegate districts, is probably defeated. Hoge, for state senate, is elected. The candidates on the county Democratic ticket is elected. Our Republicans are wild with joy over the news of their party victory.

Clay district, Wessel county, gives John A. Howard 12 plurality, a loss on Pendleton's vote of two years ago of 58; Big Run Grant district gives Dovener 8 more votes than John A. Howard. No comparison can be made as the precinct lines are changed.

HANCOCK COUNTY.

NEW CUMBERLAND, W. VA., Nov. 6.—The weather to-day has been awful. Snow, sleet and rain has fallen, but the Republicans have done the hardest work in years. They were out at 4 o'clock this morning sending messengers and rigs into the country to get out their vote, and worked until the last ballot went into the box to-night. The black horse precinct, the only one so far heard from in the town of New Cumberland, gives Whitaker 64, Pollock 21, Dovener 63, Howard 21. Smith, Republican, for the Legislature, 80, Anderson, his opponent, 23. Republicans claim the county by from 250 to 300. This is considered a conservative estimate.

NEW CUMBERLAND, W. VA., Nov. 6.—Further returns from Hancock county show that Dovener will carry the county by 235 majority. Whitaker runs ahead of his ticket as far as heard from. Frank H. Smith for house of delegates will have 550 majority in the district, he runs slightly ahead of his ticket in Hancock county. Three small precincts out of 10 in the county show a Republican gain of 85. A heavy vote was polled.

NEW CUMBERLAND, W. VA., Nov. 6.—The Republican majority in New Cumberland independent school district is 128, and is fully 300 in the county. The Republicans have made large gains in every district. Butler district, the South Carolina of Hancock county, has been carried by the Republicans by a majority of 15. The entire Republican ticket is elected by a majority of over 500. Smith (Rep.) candidate for house of delegates, is elected by a handsome majority. The Republicans carried every district in the county.

HARRISON COUNTY.

A Grand Showing for the Republican Ticket.

A Democratic County Goes Republican. Splendid Gains—Dovener Leads the Ticket.

WELLSBURG, W. VA., Nov. 6.—The town is wild at this hour with Republican enthusiasm. This Democratic county has gone Republican by good sale majorities. Nine of ten precincts are in as follows: For Congressman, Wellsburg, Howard 197, Dovener 336; Bethany, Howard 83, Dovener 112; Lewis', Howard 109, Dovener 72; Windy Hill, Howard 51, Dovener 50; Lazarville, Howard 63, Dovener 78; Middle Ferry, Howard 50, Dovener 70; Colliers, Howard 63, Dovener 57; total, Howard 626, Dovener 783; Dovener's majority 142.

There is but one more precinct to hear from at this hour, but as the vote polled there does not exceed 40 it is safe to say that Dovener's majority will be more than 120. The Democrats normally have a majority of 70 in this county, and have been claiming 50 for Howard. Whitaker has a total vote in the nine precincts of 708 and Pollock 494. Whitaker will be sure of 100 majority in the count. All the Republican county nominees will receive good, safe majorities, with the exception of H. W. Lindsey, for circuit clerk, who is probably beaten.

LEWIS COUNTY.

Dovener Makes Magnificent Gains in the Democratic Stronghold.

WESTON, W. VA., Nov. 6.—Seven precincts of twenty give Dovener 273 plurality. This indicates heavy Republican gains. Young, Republican, for senate running away ahead of the ticket. Giving Howard the same vote in precincts not heard from that Pendleton received in 1892, Dovener will carry the county by 47. All precincts heard from show Republican gains.

GRAFTON, W. VA., Nov. 6.—Three precincts in Court House magisterial district give Dayton 376, Wilson 182—Dayton's plurality, 194. In 1892 the same three precincts gave Wilson 344, Wilson 198, showing a Republican gain of 49.

Tyrconnell—Dayton 92, Wilson 8, a Republican gain of 20.

Kowlesburg—Dayton 103, Wilson 33, a gain of 39 for the Republicans over 1892.

A special from Jefferson county estimates Wilson's plurality at 1,200 a loss of 242. Martinsburg complete returns give Dayton 68 plurality, a gain of 71. Other voting places near town show an increased vote for the Republicans with a heavy majority for Dayton. This county will surely give Dayton 900 majority. Two years ago Morgan district gave Wisner 274 majority; now she rolls up 365 for Dayton. 750 the majority in the county two years ago.

MARION COUNTY.

Heavy Republican Gains Just as She Promised The County all Right.

FAIRMONT, W. VA., Nov. 6.—The election passed off quietly but a full vote was polled notwithstanding a most inclement day. The following precincts have been counted: Court house: Wilson 84, Dayton 97; West Fairmont, Wilson 76, Dayton 107. Owing to the redistricting of the voting places it is impossible to estimate losses or gains.

FAIRMONT, W. VA., Nov. 6.—The following are official figures: High school precinct, Wilson 45; Dayton, 96; for legislature, Brownfield (Rep.), 97; Sturm, 92; Tetrick, 44; Morgan 44.

Pallatine gives Dayton a majority of 152, and Brownfield and Sturm (Reps.), for legislature, 153. At Amos, Dayton has 14 majority, Brownfield and Sturm the same. Montana gives Wilson a majority of 25, the legislature about the same, a heavy Republican gain.

The following completes the official figures of Fairmont district: Fleming's, Dayton 111, Wilson, 138, Brownfield and Sturm (Republicans), 99 each; Tetrick and Morgan, Democrats, for legislature 150 each. Barrackville, Dayton 57, Wilson, 111; legislature, Brownfield and Sturm, 88 each. Tetrick and Morgan, 110 each. Will Give Dayton Five Hundred Majority. Largest in Her History.

BERKELEY SPRINGS, W. VA., Nov. 6.—Allen district, precinct No. 2, gives Dayton 57 majority; Henshaw 63; Robinson 57; Getzandanner 57. Precinct No. 1, Dayton 84; Bath district, precinct No. 1, Dayton 95; Henshaw 107; Robinson 94; Getzandanner 91. Precinct No. 3, Dayton 33; Henshaw 30; Robinson 31; Getzandanner 31. Precinct No. 2, Dayton 15; Henshaw 9; Robinson 13; Getzandanner 13. Caper district, precinct No. 3, Dayton 134; Henshaw 130; Robinson 125; Getzandanner 125; Rock Gap district, Dayton 21; Henshaw 23; Robinson 20; Getzandanner 20. Two years ago this district was Democratic by 1 vote. Republicans have made large gains in every district and the returns up to twelve o'clock gives Dayton a majority of 434, with four strong Republican precincts and one Democratic to year from. The county will undoubtedly give Dayton 500 majority. The Democrats concede it and it may possibly go higher. In 1892 the majority was only 328 for Harrison. The landslide was not expected by the Republicans, as they had only counted on 400 majority. No votes have yet been returned for the people's party.

Brownstown, a Democrat precinct, gives Huling and Patton 19 majority.

Huling's pluralities: Kanawha Falls 1, St. Albans 12, Montgomery 93, all heretofore Democratic.

Mink Shales gives Huling thirty majority. In '92 it gave a Democratic majority of eight.

Eagle, Fayette county, gives Huling 175, Alderson 11. Complete returns from the city give Huling 152 plurality.

At 11:30 p. m. it seems that there is no likelihood of reports being received here that will give further indication as to the result. Heavy Republican gains are reported everywhere and Huling's election seems assured. Secretary of State Chilton has received a telegram from the Second district saying Wilson is probably defeated. Nobody is making estimates. Democrats concede everything the Republicans claim. Bob Carr is probably defeated for state senate, although he led the Democratic ticket as far as heard from.

UPSHUR COUNTY

Gives a Big Republican Majority—The Whole Ticket Elected.

The People Rise in Their Might and Smite Free Trade.

GRANDEST VICTORY IN YEARS.

Unprecedented Republican Majorities Throughout the Country.

NEW YORK STATE AND CITY SWEEP

By a Political Cyclone and Tammany is Downed.

DEMOCRATIC DISTRICTS CARRIED

For the First Time in Years and Republican Districts

MORE THAN OUTDO THEMSELVES

A Protection Majority in Congress and the Senate Will be that Way Also—The Great Victory for Home Industries—The People Administer an Empathic Rebuke to the Tariff Tinkers and Call a Halt on the Ruinous Policy of the Democracy. Hill Meets With His Waterloo.

The great cause of protection to American industries has scored a victory. A tremendous tidal wave of protectionism swept over the country from Maine to California and the free traders were utterly routed, horse, foot and dragon. Never before in the history of this nation has there been an expression of the people so pronounced and emphatic; never did the voters of the country render a verdict so significant.

The next Congress will be Republican beyond a doubt by a good working majority, and this insures an impossibility for the tariff tinkers to carry out their threats to continue the war on the defenses of our industries, and keep up the business uncertainty that has brought the people so much disaster.

In New York David B. Hill has been defeated by a majority so large that it may require six figures to express it. The Tammany Tiger has been slain in his lair in New York City and the good people of the metropolis have placed the stamp of their righteous condemnation on the whole corrupt crowd.

Republican states everywhere have increased their majorities tremendously, and Democratic states have, in one instance, at least, West Virginia, been revolutionized.

The solid south is broken!

The cause of protection won because it was righteous. That is why the people rejoice and why the INTELLIGENCER presents the smiling countenance of the same old coin.

NEW YORK, Nov. 6.—Joseph Manley, chairman of the Republican national executive committee, has sent the following telegram of congratulation:

NEW YORK, Nov. 6.—The scene on newspaper row at 8:30 to-night when it was conceded by the Democratic organs that Morton had won the governorship and Strong the mayoralty, was one of wild enthusiasm.

When the newspaper bulletins and stereopticons began to display the returns about 6 o'clock there were about 2,000 persons on Park Row, but during the following two hours, the crowd was augmented by a continuous stream of people from the up-town districts. By 8 o'clock fully 10,000 people thronged the thoroughfare, blocking the cars and impeding the horse and cable car traffic. When the concessions by the Democrats were announced there seemed to be three Republicans to one Democrat present.

What Gilroy Said.

NEW YORK, Nov. 6.—At 8 o'clock to-night Mayor Gilroy said:

"The returns are more eloquent than anything I can say."

When he was told of the probable defeat of Wilson in West Virginia, he remarked: "That is good."

Ex-Mayor Grant issued the following statement:

"We concede the loss of the state and acknowledge our defeat in the city."

Grant's Cheerful View.

NEW YORK, Nov. 6.—Ex-Mayor Grant to-night made the following statement: "I am defeated. On the retirement of Mr. Straus I thought it my duty to the Democratic party to accept its nomination for mayor of this city. I made my canvass on Democratic issues and have gone down with my party. The principles of the party are essential to the life of the republic. Victories will be won in the future as they have in the past. It is the duty of all Democrats to present a solid front to the common enemy. Democrats never work as well together as in the hour of defeat. All differences will be laid aside and the Democratic vote of this city will be preserved as
