Gordon Dayton Buries Him Under 2,200 Majority.

FOUR THOUSAND FOR DOVENER.

And Ohio County Gives Sixteen Hundred of It.

HULING AND MILLER ARE ELECTED

By Majorities of from Two Thousand to Thirty-five Hundred--The State Protection by a Popular Majority of Twelve Thousand--Reports from all the Districts--A Number of Democratic Counties Go Republican for the First Time--How the People of the Second District Retired the Great National Free Trade Leader to Private Life.



A solid Republican delegation to congress, by majorities in each district ranging from 2,000 to 4,500, a Republican majority in both branches of the legislature, and a Republican majority in the state on the popular vote of upwards of 12,000 are the net results of Tuesday's election in West Virginia.

West Virginia voted for protection, and served notice on the tariff tinkers at Washington that the party that threatens her industries forfeits her allegiance.

The most notable of the victories was that of the gallant young leader in the Second district in defeating re-election the greatest free trader of them all, against the tremendous power of the federal administration and unlimited money.

SECOND DISTRICT

Wilson's Snowed Under--Dayton's Majority Over Twenty-Two Hundred--A Victory Over Free Trade Signal and Decisive.

SPECIAL DISPATCH TO THE INTELLIGENCER. GRAFTON, W. VA., Nov. 7.--The official returns from the fifteen counties composing the Second congressional district have been coming in slowly all day. All the counties giving Republican majorities have been heard from.

These give Dayton pluralities as follows: Barbour, 160; Berkeley, 271; Grant, 917; Marion, 350; Mineral, 990; Morgan, 519; Monongalia, 1,044; Preston, 2,024; Taylor, 606; Tucker, 267. Total, 6,464. The following are the Democratic counties giving pluralities for Wilson. Hampshire, estimated, 1,300; Jefferson, official, 1,420; Pendleton, official, 380; Randolph, estimated, 600; Hardy, official, except one precinct, 649. Total, 4,249. Majority for Dayton above 2,215.

The defeat of the great free trader is signal and decisive. He gives way to a "better man."

The headquarters of the congressional committees here are practically closed. Chairman McGraw went to Morgantown this morning to attend the funeral of a friend and Chairman Hall has gone to his home at Philippi. Republicans are jubilant over the great victory in district, the state and the nation.



It will be 2,024, or very close to that magnificent figure. All the county ticket went through a whirling with the usual majorities. This magnificent majority calls for a "thuse," a grand old Republican thuse, and the people can keep a look out in this direction, for things will be painted a Dayton red one of these nights. BERKELEY COUNTY

Makes a Magnificent Gain--Wilson Behind in His Own County.

NEXT CONGRESS

Will be Republican by a Larger Majority Than Expected.

THE SENATE ALSO REPUBLICAN

Although the Populists Will Hold the Balance of Power.

REVOLUTION OF LAST TUESDAY

One of the Most Remarkable in History of the Country.

WONDERFUL MAJORITIES PILED UP

In Republican States and Democratic States in the Balance--The Solid South Broken--The Estimate Chairman Babcock Makes of the Composition of the House of Representatives as it Will be After the Fourth of Next March--Later Returns from the Elections.

WASHINGTON, D. C., Nov. 7.--When Chairman Babcock of the Republican congressional committee, left the Republican headquarters to-night, he said that the reports received during the day gave the Republicans 230 out of the 356 members of the house beyond peradventure, while there was a possibility of securing 27 additional members. The members which he believes to be certainly elected are distributed as follows:

- Alabama, 1; California, 6; Colorado, 2; Connecticut, 4; Delaware, 1; Idaho, 1; Illinois, 19; Indiana, 13; Iowa, 10; Kansas, 5; Kentucky, 5; Maine, 4; Maryland, 4; Massachusetts, 13; Michigan, 13; Minnesota, 4; Missouri, 3; Montana, 1; Nebraska, 5; New Hampshire, 2; New Jersey, 7; New York, 39; North Carolina, 2; North Dakota, 1; Ohio, 19; Oregon, 2; Pennsylvania, 25; Rhode Island, 2; South Carolina, 1; South Dakota, 3; Tennessee, 4; Vermont, 2; Washington, 2; West Virginia, 4; Wisconsin, 10; Wyoming, 1. Total, 230.

Mr. Babcock also stated that his information leads him to believe that there is a possibility of securing three more members from Alabama; two from Illinois, one from Iowa, Kansas, Kentucky, Nebraska and South Carolina, each; three more from Minnesota, two from Ohio, two from Pennsylvania, three from Missouri, one from Arkansas, three from Louisiana, and three from Texas.

If these are realized, it will give the Republicans 257 members, or a majority of 99 members.

According to the claims of the Republicans, they will be able to secure the votes of at least thirty of the forty-four states in case the next presidential election is thrown into the house, as they will have either the solid delegations or a majority in each of the delegations from that number of states.

A REPUBLICAN SENATE

As Well as House Will Be the Result of the Elections.

WASHINGTON, D. C., Nov. 7.--Reports received up to 8 o'clock to-night indicate that the next senate will have 40 Democrats and 41 Republicans and 6 Populists, while the attitude of the successor to Senator Harris, of Tennessee, is still in doubt. In this classification, Senators Stewart and Jones, of Nevada, who were elected by the Republicans, but have announced their separation from that party, and Governor Tillman, who will doubtless be elected by the so-called Independent Democrats, are placed in the Populist column. Tillman (South Carolina) will probably vote with the Democrats on organization, and Stewart and Jones, of Nevada, and Poffor, with the Republicans. This would throw the balance of power into the hands of the Populists. The senate by states are as follows:

TRIES TO EXPLAIN IT.

Senator Faulkner Frankly Acknowledges, in Effect, that the People Were Disgusted With the Party.

WASHINGTON, D. C., Nov. 7.--Senator Faulkner, chairman of the Democratic congressional campaign committee, was asked to-day for an expression of opinion of the election.

"I don't desire to go into a discussion of the causes leading to the tidal wave which has placed the Republicans in power again in the house," he remarked. "But I think it is proper to note that these evidences of apparent popular approval in the election of so large a majority of a party to the control of the house is not evidence of a change by the voter of his political principles."

"The history of politics will show," continued the senator, "that every

landslide is the result of dissatisfaction, discontent and want of confidence of the members of the majority party, whose action produces the result that surprises and astonishes the people--not by voting the opposite ticket, but simply by remaining away from the polls. The results of this election when ascertained, will, I am sure, verify this conclusion. We have seen many voters in the country as we had in '92, who believe in the principles of the Democratic party, but the recent business paralysis, financial stringency, economic legislation--the benefits of which have not been developed--party dissensions, crimonations and recriminations have resulted in such apathy as to cause the stay-at-home vote to produce the surprising result of yesterday. That is my honest judgment."

"To what do you attribute the result in West Virginia?" inquired the reporter.

"The same causes that have affected and influenced the voters throughout the country, which I have already enumerated to you," he replied.

NEW YORK MAJORITY.

Morton's Plurality Over 153,000--His Majority 126,000.

NEW YORK, Nov. 7.--The total corrected vote for governor of New York state, Sullivan county out, stands as follows: Hill, 514,073; Morton, 607,419; Wheeler, 27,108; total, 1,208,600.

Morton's plurality, 153,348; Morton's majority, 126,238.

OHIO'S VOTE.

Greatest Majority in Her History--Practically Solid Congressional Delegation.

CINCINNATI, O., Nov. 7.--Specials to the Times-Star say A. S. McClure, Republican, has 1,200 plurality in the Seventeenth district and that the Republicans have carried all the twenty-one congressional districts in Ohio except the Third and Fourth. The Fourth is in doubt. The plurality of Sorg, (Dem.) is 150 in the Third district.

A dispatch from Eaton states that General Harris has made such gains there that he does not concede his defeat by Sorg and says it will require the official count to tell the result. While the Republican plurality in Ohio is almost double McKinley's plurality of 80,000 last year the total vote for the Republican ticket yesterday falls several thousand short of the vote for McKinley last year, showing that the result is due to the Democratic vote not coming out.

S. M. Taylor, who was re-elected secretary of state by such a large majority, had a plurality of 1,080 two years ago.

GREAT IS OHIO.

She Beats Her Record--The Majority 150,000.

CINCINNATI, O., Nov. 7.--More complete returns indicate that the Republican plurality for secretary of state will exceed 150,000. The present Ohio delegation in congress consists of eleven Democrats and ten Republicans. The newly elected delegation consists of nineteen Republicans and two Democrats. The Republicans do not concede the election of Sorg in the Third and Layton in the Fourth districts, their pluralities being less than one hundred.

TENNESSEE IN DOUBT.

Congressman Enloe Will be Succeeded by a Republican.

JACKSON, TENN., Nov. 7.--Congressman B. A. Enloe is defeated on the face of the returns in the Eighth district. The Democratic executive committee has just conceded McCall's election. The state is in doubt.

MEMPHIS, TENN., Nov. 7.--The Commercial-Appeal claims the election of Peter Turner, Democrat, for governor by 8,000 plurality. Chairman W. H. Carroll, of the Democratic state committee, denies most emphatically that he has conceded the election of H. C. Evans, Republican.

CHATTANOOGA, TENN., Nov. 7.--Chairman Carroll, of the Democratic state committee, telegraphs II. Clay Evans his congratulations and concedes his election by at least 5,000.

DAYTON, O., Nov. 7.--For Congress, Third district, P. J. Sorg, Democrat, elected by 266.

COLORADO.

Bloody Battles Wait Think He Knows How It Was Done.

DENVER, Nov. 7.--Governor Waite conceded the defeat of his party early to-day.

"To my mind," he said, "it proves conclusively that the money has dominated this election from the beginning to the end, and the Democratic party is most responsible for the fact that they voted the Republican ticket instead of their own. I believe that the influence of Wall street must be removed from Congress. The result in Colorado can be accounted for from the fact that the Democrats have almost to a man voted Republican ticket."

Iowa's Good Showing.

STOW CITY, IOWA, Nov. 7.--The total vote in the state is estimated at 70,000. All returns show Republican gains. Governor Sheldon places his plurality at 18,000, against 1,000 in '92. Pickler and Gamble, Republican candidates for Congress, and the entire state ticket are also elected by big pluralities.

Montana Republican.

HELENA, MONT., Nov. 7.--Chairman Lant states that Hartman, Republican, for Congress, and Hunt, Republican, for associate justice, are undoubtedly elected. He claims the legislature will be Republican by fifteen on joint ballot.

Wisconsin's Vote.

MILWAUKEE, WIS., Nov. 7.--Complete returns from sixty-five out of seventy counties in the state give a Republican plurality of 51,620. This will probably be increased by the returns to come. The Republicans gain six congressmen.

Boise, Idaho.

BOISE, IDAHO, Nov. 7.--The entire Republican ticket is elected by 2,000 majority or more. The returns indicate that the legislature will be Republican. Mormon votes have been very strongly Republican.

Wyoming all Right.

CHEYENNE, WYO., Nov. 7.--Meagra returns so far received indicate the election of the entire Republican state ticket, of Mondell, (Rep.), for congress
