BIG IMPROVEMENTS

To be Made by the Wheeling Railway Company This Spring.

THE OLD FIVE MINUTE SCHEDULE

To be Restored in April—New and Improved and More Powerful Motors Have Also Been Ordered—Five New Summer Car Bodies Also Purchased—Old Cars Being Refitted. An Improvement in the Business of the Lines.

It is a matter of comment among strangers in Wheeling that the city has the best electric street car service in any community of like class in the country. Ever since the Champion-Kimball people secured control three years ago improvement has been the order of the day, and the difference between the system of that date and today is wonderful indeed. There was but one retrogressive step in these three years—the lapse from a five minute schedule into one calling for a car passing a given point every eight minutes, and that was caused by the depression in all lines of business about eighteen months ago.

General Manager W. S. Wright, of the Wheeling Railway Company, was seen yesterday afternoon and made the announcement that the five minute schedule is to be restored in a few weeks. In addition other improvements are to be made and the road placed on a higher standard than ever before. On the eight minute schedule on the average about eighteen cars are in use on the line, but with the restoration of the more frequent runs twenty-five cars will be in active use all the time.

In the world of electricity no quicker strides in the way of improved apparatus are being made than in street cars. Machines that were up to date two years ago are now something old fashioned. This is especially true in regard to street car motors, and the latest machines are greatly improved over those of two years ago. Mr. Wright says that his company will replace all of the motors, twenty-five in number, with the latest improved motors recently put on the market by the General Electric Company. They will be equipped with the "Type K" controller, something new that does away with the cables now in use, which frequently break and make trouble for the repair force of the company. The motors now in use are of thirty horse power, and the new ones are to be nearly twice as powerful, fifty horse power.

In addition, five new summer car bodies have been ordered and will be here early in April, about the same time the new motors will put in an appearance. In the meantime a force of men at the Forty-eighth street barns are working on the summer cars that were retired from active service last fall, and all will be repainted with the company's regulation color—yellow. The restoration of the five minute schedule will be especially pleasing to the patrons of the road, and General

Manager Wright states that the prospective business will justify the improvements. He says the winter business of the street car line has been very good and the prospects for the summer are first class. Surely Wheeling is fortunate in having such an enterprising set of men at the head of its street transportation lines.

The company will also improve its track in places, including the placing of crossings of improved pattern at Bridgeport, at Sixteenth and Market streets, at Sixteenth and Main streets and two in Bonwood.
