JOHN McCONAUGHY, SR., DEAD.

Bridgeport Loses One of Her Oldest and Most Respected Citizens. The death of John McConaughy, sr., of Bridgeport, yesterday morning, removes one of the best known and most highly respected citizens of that town. He was born April 19, 1814, at Short Creek, Jefferson county, Ohio, removed to Bridgeport about 1820, where he worked as a bricklayer and stone mason until the breaking out of the civil war; entering Company I, First West Virginia Cavalry and serving until the close of the war when he returned to Bridgeport and engaged in the grocery business in West Bridgeport. He was married about 1838 to Miss Mary Ann Howell, who died 1855. After the death of his first wife he married Miss Emma Schrock, of St. Clairsville, who died in 1860. In 1867 he was again married to Miss Mary Pool, who still survives him, together with six children, viz: Howell McConaughy, Mrs. Robert Giffin and Mrs. William Smith, of Bridgeport, and Mrs. Anell Clozdown, of Adair, Indian Territory, by his first wife, and Joseph and John F. McConaughy by his last wife. The funeral will take place Friday afternoon at 2 o'clock.


