A Popular Delusion Exploited by a Well Known Economist. J. Laurence Langhina, of the Chicago University, in Times-Herald.

A very common argument advanced in these days by those who advocate free coinage of silver is that silver has the same purchasing power to-day it had in 1873.

The inference from this is that it is gold which has gone up, leaving silver and goods alike down below.

On this question we happen to have the most extensive study on prices ever made. This study is contained in seven volumes of the so-called Aldrich senate report.

Representing the sum of money which could buy 232 articles in 1860 by the index number 100, we can see by any variations from that in other years whether it took more or less money to buy the 232 articles.

What is the lesson? That in the United States, since 1860, silver has fallen from 15.29 to 32.58, or over one-half.

Silver is now selling about 67 cents an ounce fine. If it were raised to par—so that 371 grains in a dollar piece should be equal to 100 cents in gold—is should sell for about 127 cents.
