JULY WEATHER.

Records of the Past Seven Years in West Virginia.

The following data, compiled from the weather bureau records at Parkersburg, W. Va., cover the period given for the month named, and should prove of value and interest in anticipating the more important meteorological elements, and the range within which such variations may be expected to keep for the coming month of July.

Month of July for seven years: Temperature—Mean or normal temperature, 71 degrees. The warmest month was that of 1893, with an average of 70 degrees. The coldest month was that of 1891, with an average of 70 degrees.
